

April 6: Fifth Sunday in Lent Read John 12:1-8

Mary gave Jesus a costly gift as she anointed his feet with perfume. In this season of Lent, what gift would you offer Jesus to show your love for him? Share with a family member or friend.

April 13: Palm/Passion Sunday


Today begins Holy Week, when we remember the events between Jesus' entry into Jerusalem to this death of the cross before his resurrection. On Thursday, we celebrate Maundy Thursday, the night when Jesus gave his disciples a new commandment – to love one another. Make a list of ways you can show your love to your family members this week and do so.

April 20: Resurrection of the Lord Sunday Read Luke 24:1-12

On Easter Sunday, we celebrate the good news of the angel that Jesus' tomb was empty; Jesus had been raised and was alive! With your friends and family, share the ancient greeting: "Christ is risen!" to which they may respond, "He is risen indeed." Be prepared to share the response if others greet you this way. See how many know the response when you greet them.

April 27: Second Sunday of Easter Read John 20:19-31

Thomas couldn't believe what the other disciples told him about having seen the risen Jesus; he needed to see him for himself. Jesus returned and Thomas believed. What causes you to doubt? Acknowledge your doubts before Christ and ask him to help you trust and believe.

March Session Digest

WORSHIP (W): On March 2, an estimated 27 home and 22 in-person communicants celebrated communion. The next communion will be on April 6. If you are joining worship at home that day, please

remember to prepare your elements in advance.

Preparations are underway for Passion Week, and Easter. **The Good Friday service will be held at noon.**

We hope you will make in-person worship a regular part of the start of each week.

ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE (A&F): The balance sheet has about \$72,200 in the general account. A \$7,000 City National Bank account has been opened from which to pay about 10 months of the solar panel project loan payments until government rebates reduce the project loan from about \$95,000 to about \$40,000. In the budget vs. actual, the February month shows a \$700 positive balance, with the February YTD balance of -\$2377.

CHRISTIAN NURTURE (CN): A women's circle meeting is planned for Tuesday, March 25 at 7pm.

MISSION & SERVICE (M&S): The Pearl Inghram Scholarship will be moved to earlier than the end of each school year. 2025 applications are open to RLPC-related or SCHS graduating students, and must be returned by May 1.

The next special offering will be One Great Hour of Sharing, during Lent.

PROPERTY (P): The grass cutting contractor, will cease cutting the former KPBG LLC property, as it has been sold.

The sanctuary air conditioning was started on March 16, and is working. The point LED sign is on a timer that turns it off about 11pm, and on again about 8am. We are determining the least expensive way to take the sign off the timer.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE (CC): The next potluck will be April 13. See you there!

OTHER(O): The clerk reported the he corresponded with Presbytery-recommended lawyer Don Parker, at Spilman Thomas & Battle, PLLC. Don in turn advised that as associate, Eric Gadd, would be handling deed transfers from the unincorporated Rock Lake Presbyterian Church to the incorporated entity we created in July, 2022, Rock Lake Presbyterian Church Incorporated. Eric's discounted hourly rate will be \$250. Stay tuned for updates.

The clerk reported that the \$94,939 City National Bank (CNB) loan for the solar panel project has been approved.
