

Sales run through the end of November. We encourage you to share this information with families, friends, and neighbors using social media, email, or in person (socially distanced). If they're not comfortable ordering online, just record their purchases on the order form and collect payment from them before placing the order. If they order online, Scott will update you about your sales.

Nurturing Moments

Please use these suggested scriptures, questions, and activities to help you explore your faith.

October 3 - Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost/Proper 22: Read Mark 10:2-16

Jesus told the disciples that whoever does not receive the kingdom as a little child will never enter it. We must disregard our goals of fame and fortune and turn to God as powerless children. How do you need to change your thinking to make this happen?

October 10 - Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost/Proper 23: Read Mark 10:17-31

It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God. Wealth and honor will not get you into the kingdom. How do you prioritize your need for wealth and your desire to enter the kingdom of God?

October 17 - Twenty-First Sunday after Pentecost/Proper 24: Read Job 38:1-7

Job has suffered greatly, and his friends give advice. Elihu puts Job in his place, so to speak, declaring

his unworthiness to question God. God's response is a rebuke to Elihu and friends who speak without knowledge. Job, in his anguish, yells at God; do you ever do the same? How does God respond?

October 24 – Twenty-Second Sunday after Pentecost/Proper 25: Read Mark 10:46-52 Jesus heals Bartimaeus' eyesight because of the faith with which he shouted out to Jesus, and he becomes a follower of Jesus. Bartimaeus did not fear the rebukes of the disciples but continued to call out in faith. How can you and your family work to strengthen your faith, considering your trials and suffering, so you call upon Jesus for help?

October 31 – Twenty-Third Sunday after Pentecost/Proper 26: Read Mark 12:25-34 Although Jesus is often critical of scribes, this one agrees with the most important commandments necessary to be a follower: Love God and your neighbor. How do you live out these commandments in your everyday life?

September, 2021 Session Digest

WORSHIP (W): The estimated number of communicants in the September 5 communion was 56. The next communion will be on October 3 and will be served in the same manner we have used since returning to live worship; bread packets will be distributed with your bulletin, while the cup will be served by elders. If you are joining worship at home, please remember to prepare your elements.

Liturgists are needed in October and November. There is a sign-up sheet in the narthex; please consider serving. If you participate, please arrive 30 minutes before the service begins.

ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE (A&F): Session approved a committee motion to begin diverting the Lincoln Avenue rental home and future property sale income to the KPBG LLC, a corporation created by four member families to purchase the former Kirkhart property in 2014.

We are contacting Gerald Burgy, city maintenance manager, about removing the fallen tree behind the CLC pavilions.

The parking lot lines will be repainted in the spring.

CHRISTIAN NURTURE (CN):

MISSION & SERVICE (M&S): The Peace and Global Witness offering is October 3.

PROPERTY (P): The carpet in the sanctuary, parlor, hallway, and office has been cleaned. A plugged up roof drain in the bridge entry door roof needs cleaned, to stop water from running off the roof edge when it rains.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE (CC): We will have the October 10 potluck in the breezeway following worship, weather permitting. Attendees should bring individual sack meals. Water and lemonade will be provided.

OTHER: Session discussed a May 27 mailing from presbytery. The mailing was a proposal for <u>all</u> West Virginia congregations to incorporate. As noted in the mailing, **the reason for a church to incorporate is to limit liability**. Session approved beginning the process to incorporate. Based on First Presbyterian Church, Clarksburg's completed incorporation process, the session is authorized to carry out the incorporation process. Questions? Call me at 304-768-8565.
