



Sales run through the end of November. We encourage you to share this information with families, friends, and neighbors using social media, email, or in person (socially distanced). If they're not comfortable ordering online, just record their purchases on the order form and collect payment from them before placing the order. If they order online, Scott will update you about your sales.

Please use these suggested scriptures, questions, and activities to help you explore your faith.

November 7 – Twenty-Fourth Sunday after Pentecost/Proper 27: Read Mark 12:38-44

This month, we turn our thoughts to giving thanks and stewardship. Jesus reminds us of the importance of giving not out of our abundance, but out of our poverty. What does this mean to you, and how will this affect your offerings to the church?

November 14 – Twenty-Fifth Sunday after Pentecost/Proper 28: Read Mark 13:1-8

These verses are warnings of things to come, and false leaders are of concern. Jesus said, "Do not let them lead you astray." How are you led astray by the leaders we encounter in our lives? Create a plan to counteract this temptation.

November 21 - Christ the King/Reign of Christ: Read John 18:33-37

On this Christ the King Sunday, we find Jesus confronted by Pilate, who wants to know if Jesus is indeed the king of the Jews. How do you answer this question in your own life? Is Jesus your King? If so, how do you honor your King?

November 28 - First Sunday of Advent: Read Luke 21:25-36

As we enter this Advent Season, our Scripture passage speaks of signs of the coming of the Son of Man in a cloud with power and glory. How do you visualize this scene depicted in the Scripture passage? Draw a picture with your family to depict His coming.

October, 2021 Session Digest

WORSHIP (W): The estimated number of communicants in the October 3 communion was 45. The next communion will be on

November 7 and will be served in the same manner we have used since returning to live worship; bread packets will be distributed with your bulletin, while the cup will be served by elders. **If you are joining worship at home, please remember to prepare your elements.**

Stewardship messages will be November 7 and 14; November 21 will be Commitment Sunday. Advent begins on November 28. Christmas decorations need to be up by then. If you can help assemble the Christmas tree on Monday, November 22 at 11a.m., please call the church office at 304-768-4141 and leave your name & number. A joint Christmas Eve service with First Presbyterian Church was approved; the location is yet to be determined.

Session also approved establishing an inclement weather policy and notification system to help determine when worship would be canceled in bad weather.

ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE (A&F): The stewardship mailing will be made on November 1.

CHRISTIAN NURTURE (CN):

MISSION & SERVICE (M&S): Session approved donating the Peacemaking & Global Witness offering local portion to the Bridgeview Bag project. The Bridgeview Bag Project provides 65 food bags each month to Bridgeview Elementary School. You can help by donating specific food items and by helping to assemble bags after worship on the last Sunday of each month. The first assembly Sunday will be after worship on October 31. This will be a great time to return to worship, and return to service!

PROPERTY (P): The Appalachian Behavioral Health Care (ABHC) has been using the church's riding lawn mower to mow the CLC lawn. Since ABHC has purchased a replacement, the original mower is no longer needed. Interested? Call John Solberg.
