By the time you read this in the March newsletter, we will be deep in Lent, preparing for Easter. I am hopeful that you are doing some spiritual preparation for that day – it is the most important event in our faith. Perhaps you are taking some opportunities that the church is offering, renewing commitment to attending worship, using daily devotional readings, perhaps choosing one or more of the suggestions offered as Lenten disciplines, or maybe doing some other activity to help get ready for the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection. If this hasn't happened for you yet, it's not too late!

But think with me for a moment about Easter Sunday and the season that follows. We do many things at Easter to proclaim our faith and our joy. We dress up. We decorate. We go to church. We sing. And we hear the resurrection stories: Mary Magdalene in the garden, Peter and John and the empty tomb, the folded grave clothes. We know these stories well, but we want to hear them again. Jesus has conquered death and shown us the resurrected life!

One striking detail in many of the Resurrection stories is that Jesus came, but at first the disciples did not recognize him. No one fully understands what this means, but at the very least it means Jesus was changed in some way. However, little we understand what happened on that first Easter, we can say this: Jesus was raised from death, and points us toward a next step, a transformation. He is transformed. And in him, we are also being transformed. Every day, our faith tells us that our lives are being changed. We are becoming like Jesus, moment by moment, day by day.

In the meantime, as we journey through Lent, let us each be deliberate about how we will spend this season. Let it not be "business as usual," lest Easter Sunday be just another day. Choose right now how you observe the weeks of Lent. And may each of us be granted a holy Lent, as we deepen our friendship with the Crucified Christ, and prepare to celebrate his resurrection.

Repairers of the Breach

Kintsugi, the 15th-century Japanese art of repairing broken pottery by mending the broken areas with lacquer dusted or mixed with powdered gold or other precious metal, reminds us that when repaired, formerly broken places reveal new lines of character and beauty.

But what of God's world? The world God entrusted to our care? So many parts are broken, damaged by cruelty to each other, misuse of Creation or refusal to take God's commands seriously.

In Isaiah 58, the prophet reminds us, "You shall be called repairers of the breach." Repairers. And as we question the breaches that may have resulted from our own actions, we ponder how to repair them, creating something unique, beautiful and resilient. Which ones get attention first? How can we repair a breach that may have existed for decades or one that has only recently emerged? Where can we work for repair to reveal beautiful new veins of gold?

In a world of disaster, hunger, and oppression, millions of people lack access to sustainable food sources, clean water, sanitation, education, and opportunity. The three programs supported by





SCHOLARSHIPS AND LOANS

AVAILABLE THROUGH

THE PRESBYTERY OF WEST VIRGINIA

(Grants and loans available for students in academic or vocational courses of study.)



THE RINER FUND provides loans for Presbyterian Church (USA) students in the Presbytery of West Virginia, with preference for those attending Presbyterian Colleges. Loans are available for academic or vocational courses of study. The maximum amount of a loan is \$1,000 per year. Loans may be renewed up to four years, if so requested. Loans are to be repaid beginning six months after graduation or termination of studies, unless a deferment is requested during graduate studies.

THE SCHOLARSHIP FUND is used for grants for the education of dependent students in West Virginia, with preference given to those whose legal residence is Boone County. Maximum amount of grant is \$500.

Information, including an application form, can be found at found at www.wvpresbytery.org and will be emailed to church leaders in early March.

The application deadline is April 30, 2023.
