

Renowned composer and conductor Timothy 'Tim' Waugh, a native of South Charleston, West Virginia, passed away on Thursday, February 8, 2024, after a long battle with Polycystic Kidney Disease (PKD). He bravely fought the illness for years, undergoing a kidney transplant 18 years prior to his death. Waugh was internationally acclaimed for his contributions to classical music, particularly handbell music.

Course Description: Is there more to preaching Pentecost than wearing red and a birthday cake for the church? And what about the long season after Pentecost - how do we preach to keep people engaged and growing in this time? Our time together will explore the contours of preaching on the day of Pentecost and strategies for preaching during the summer months after Pentecost. Our work together will be based on the Revised Common Lectionary texts for Year B.

Leader: Rich Voelz is the Associate Professor of Preaching & Worship at Union Presbyterian Seminary and is based on the Richmond, VA campus, where he has served since 2016. He has authored three books, including <u>Preaching to Teach: Inspire People to Think and Act</u> (Abingdon Press, 2019), <u>Tending the Tree of Life: Preaching and Worship Through Reproductive Loss and Adoption</u> (Energion Publications, 2018), and <u>Youthful Preaching: Strengthening the Relationship Between Youth, Adults, and Preaching</u> (Cascade Books, 2016). Dr. Voelz also directs The Bridge for Early Career Preachers, which provides resources, continuing education, and a supportive community for those who are moving from aspiring to active preaching ministries.

2024 One Great Hour of Sharing



Ruling Elder Preparation/Training for Presiding at the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper



on Zoom April 28, 2024 3-5 p.m., with advance assignments

Why: One of the responsibilities of all councils of the church – session, presbytery, synod and General Assembly – is to "provide that the Sacraments may be rightly administered and received." (G 3-3.0101) The presbytery has a responsibility for "authorizing and training specific ruling elders to administer or preside at the Lord's Supper when it deems it necessary to meet the needs for the administration of the Sacrament." (G-3.0301b)

One way the Presbytery of West Virginia seeks to fulfill this responsibility is with training events.

These are offered on a yearly basis.

Who: Ruling elders in good standing who are approved by their Session to participate in this training in order to preside at communion in their congregation of membership. Session approval can be submitted before or after the course. Elders do not have to be serving on the session at this time but are required to complete assignments in advance of the course and turn them in, and attend the entire event.

The registration deadline for this event is Friday, April 19.

WORSHIP (W): On February 4, RLPC had an estimated 35 communicants between on-line and live. The next communion celebration will be March 3. **If you are**

joining worship at home that day, please remember to prepare your elements in advance.

ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE (A&F): The December 2023 YTD ending budget vs. actual balance was \$4,863, the amount by which income exceed expenses at the end of 2023. Session approved closing the West Virginia Federal Credit Union account balance of \$4,927.48 and transferring those funds to the New Covenant Fund.

CHRISTIAN NURTURE (CN):

MISSION & SERVICE (M&S): The One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) season will be Lent. The OGHS offering will be taken on Easter. See the OGHS article elsewhere in this newsletter.

PROPERTY (P): Several heating system components have been repaired. The sanctuary hot water heating pump still needs to be replaced. The bridge door chandelier has been cleaned, and its lights replaced with LED bulbs. We still seek a janitorial service; if you have suggestions, please contact Sandy in the office. We are investigating repair of the parking lot potholes.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE (CC): The next second Sunday potluck will be March 10. Don't forget, the most important ingredient is Y-O-U!

OTHER: The session approved the 2024 covenant with Rev. Dr. Patricia Jarvis. The clerk forwarded the covenant to the presbytery secretary on January 20, 2024.
