We welcome Reverend Clare J. Sulgit as our guest columnist this month. She is pastor at St. Marys United Methodist Church in St. Marys, WV, and is the daughter of our own pastor, Patricia. Clare shares some ideas for welcoming first-time visitors to church. Welcome Clare!

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

What a wonderful time of year this is! I was waiting all winter for these summer days. I wake in the morning to hear birds singing, everyone's yards are filled with flowers and vegetables, and things seem just a touch more relaxed. Summer also signifies something else; it is a perfect time to invite someone to come to church for the first time or come back to church. We all come out of our winter hibernation in summer and it's a great time to invite someone to begin the habit of attending church with you.

So a good question to ask is what is it first-time visitors are searching for? When a visitor crosses our church's threshold, will they come back? There are 4 characteristics that usually persuade people to return. According to Win Arn of *Church Growth Inc.* they are in this order:

- The friendliness and warmth of the congregation. A United Methodist study found "when both unchurched and churched people are asked what they look for in a church; they are looking for a church in which they feel at home, where the people are friendly, and where there is a warm and comfortable atmosphere." When is this most effectively conveyed? When visitors first come into the building, and when the worship service is over and people begin to leave.
- The character of the worship service. Is the worship service authentic? Do people sense the presence of God? Does worship offer grace, conveying the truth, hope and power of God's love? Is worship a time of celebration? Do people leave more joyfully than when they arrived? Are they strengthened and equipped for the realities of life?
- Does our church provide opportunities for children, or are children a distraction? Churches providing, for children's needs are providing a gateway for children's parents to call our congregation "home". For those who don't have children, the adult program provides a way to involve the unchurched adults in getting to know people and becoming a part of our church family.
- How about our church building? Is it visible? Is it accessible? Is it in good condition? Do we have adequate space?

These are the characteristics that will influence a first-=time visitor to return. However the most effective way we can influence a visitor is to invite them personally to attend church with us and bring them into church with use. Our personal relationship with God should always be reflected in our relationships with

others. So let's all try to make more of an effort to share God's love and good news with those around us and just maybe, bring a new face to church!

June 2024 Session Digest

WORSHIP (W): On June 2, an estimated 57 communicants between online and live celebrated communion. The next communion celebration will be on July 7. **If you are joining worship at home that day, please**

remember to prepare your elements in advance.

The committee hosted the Summer Social after worship on June 23.

The committee is working on the anniversary service on October 27.

Plans for end-of-year worship (Thanksgiving and Advent) are also being developed.

Thanks to Linda and Fred Reehling, who are restoring place-marking ribbon cards to the sanctuary hymnals.

Several in-person worshipers have reported that the volume was not consistently loud enough during worship.

ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE (A&F): The general account has a \$72,677 balance. The budget vs. actual shows an April month balance of \$1,905, and \$868 for April 2024 YTD. A check for \$37,387.47 has been received from the church's insurance company to cover loss to RLPC in the April flood at the RLCLC. This money will be used to pay Rainbow Restoration, the company engaged to restore the RLCLC. Appalachian Behavioral Health Care (ABHC) re-occupied the RLCLC a few days before the May session meeting.

CHRISTIAN NURTURE (CN): Craft and teaching materials have been ordered for the nursery.

MISSION & SERVICE (M&S): To date, RLPC has received one application for the Pearl Inghram scholarship. The last day to submit an application is July 8 by 1pm.

PROPERTY (P): The bird droppings outside the bridge entry have been cleaned.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE (CC): The next second Sunday potluck will be July 14 after worship. Don't forget, the most important ingredient is Y-O-U! Join us for food and fellowship!

OTHER: a. The corporation annual report has been submitted to the state of WV. This report is due by June 30 of each year. b. Oakwood Terrace management is going through upheaval, resulting in the loss of a roughly \$3,000 per year Christmas Project donation from National Church Residency. This shortfall may affect the 2024 Oakwood Terrace Christmas Project. c. An inmate at Mount Olive Correctional Complex has requested a pen pal. Our next step is for Mission and Service to contact the prison to ensure that RLPC knows their protocol for corresponding with inmates.
