## Expo Stresses Messaging, Volunteer Engagement, Inclusion, Diversity

More than 150 Democrats learned about the everyday issues facing Manatee County residents and heard solutions during the Democratic Party's 2022 & You Expo & Workshop at the Manatee Performing Arts Center, Saturday, July 23.



Manatee County Democratic Party Chair Tracy Pratt set the tone of the gathering with her rousing opening remarks, "Our freedom and democracy are on the line. Let me remind you that we Democrats are 80,000 strong in Manatee. You are not alone."

Expo attendees connected with Democratic clubs, caucuses, team leaders and engaged with local candidates during the event. The Expo is an opportunity for concerned citizens to volunteer and work with the Democratic Party on issues that face everyone in the county.

The general session focused on Democratic messaging for the August and November elections in areas such as women's reproductive health, education, the environment, gun safety and the economy. #### Who Are the Democratic Candidates on the August Ballot?

**Manatee County School Board.** This non-partisan race could decide who remains or becomes a school board member. If no candidate gets more than 50 percent of the vote on August 23, the top two vote-getters will have a run-off in the November General Election.

### Where to Vote in the August 23 Elections?

**Vote from Home**. If you signed-up for Vote By Mail, you should have received your ballot. Follow instructions and fill out your ballot. Return your completed ballot early and track it online.

Your ballot must be received by the Manatee County Supervisor of Elections before 7 p.m. on August 23. You can request a Vote-By-Mail ballot by visiting the Supervisor of Elections website, <u>VoteManatee.gov</u>, or call 941-741-3823. You must request your Vote-By-Mail ballot before August 13.



**Early Voting.** You can go to any Manatee County Early Voting site from Saturday, August 13, through Saturday, August 20, 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. to vote in person or drop off your ballot in the secure box outside the polls during the Early Voting period. For Early Voting sites <u>click here</u>.

**Election Day August 23.** Go to your precinct voting location, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. to cast your vote. If you received a Vote-By-Mail ballot, bring it with you to the poll on Election Day. You must surrender your Vote- By-Mail ballot and you will be issued a fresh ballot. Find your voting precinct and sample ballot here.
