County Commissioners Begin Redistricting Work



The Board of County Commissioners earlier this month began the once-in-a-decade exercise of redrawing their district boundaries to conform to shifts in the population based on the latest federal Census Report. The entire county saw an increase in population; some areas of Manatee County grew larger than others.

The redrawing of district lines is required by statute and affects five commissioners who represent specific districts. Two other commissioners hold at-large positions on the seven-member board.

Since the 2010 Census, District 5 (east county including Lakewood Ranch and Tara) and District 1 (north county including Ellenton and Parrish) have seen the greatest population growth. The redrawn boundaries must create districts with relatively the same number of residents but not discriminate against minority populations.

The Commissioners have a special meeting scheduled Nov. 9 and work sessions proposed for Dec. 7 and 15 where they may take up redistricting and possibly open up for public comment. Agendas for these meetings, and any other meetings the commissioners schedule, can be found on the Manatee County Commissioners' website.
