# **Get Jubilant for Manatee's Juneteenth Festival**

Manatee County's annual Juneteenth Community Festival will take place on Saturday, June 22, from 2 to 7 p.m. at the 13th Ave. Dream Center, 922 24th St. E, Bradenton.

Juneteenth celebrates the ending of slavery in the United States, highlighting the struggle

for liberation that African Americans have attained and celebrating their enduring spirit. Through music, food and arts and crafts, the event will honor black cultures and provide an opportunity to reflect on the evolving meaning of freedom in this country.



Critical to the ongoing work of freedom is the enforcement of voting rights. The Manatee County NAACP and the Manatee County Democratic Black Caucus will be available at the festival to assist with voter registration.

Glenn Pearson, president of the caucus, said, "Our mission will be to make sure that eligible voters are registered, ensure that registrations are current, re-enroll or enroll in the Vote-By-Mail program and persuade voters to VOTE in 2024."

The significance of Juneteenth includes bringing up strong future generations. Festival organizer, The Rosalyn Walton Education and Enrichment Services, will participate in the event by offering a children's parade and a youth entrepreneur corridor. On the actual day of the holiday (June 19), the organization will offer a reading conference that includes author visits and financial literacy games. The event is free and open to everyone.

### Vote-By-Mail Emphasized at Districts 4-5 Meeting

Addressing a crowd approaching 70 volunteers, District 5 coordinator and Precinct 507 Captain Rob Usher emphasized the need for enrolling in the Vote-By-Mail (VBM) program during the May Districts 4 and 5 meeting at the Lakewood Ranch Library.

Usher reminded attendees that all voters must register for the VBM program, even if they received their ballots in the mail for previous elections. He stressed careful navigation of the Supervisor of Elections website,

https://www.votemanatee.com/Vote-By-Mail-Early-Voting/Vote-By-Mail-Ballot-Request-Online, in order to re-enroll in the program.

Democratic candidate for the County Commission District 7 (at-large) seat, Sari Lindroos-Valimaki gave a brief but impassioned request to get behind her candidacy and put a "D" on the county commission. Lindroos-Valimaki will face Aliyah Hurt in the Democratic Primary, Aug. 20.

Laurie Cusick delivered a phone banking presentation, noting that she supervises 30 phone bank volunteers. The volunteers make phone calls to Democrats with three messages: registering new Democrats; enrolling in VBM; and reminding voters of the Aug. 20 Democratic Primary.

Details as to how to approach calling were discussed. She provided templates as part of a video presentation that provided the dos and don'ts of call bank protocol. The discussion was informative, brief and concise.

## Consider Running for an Elected Community Office

Much of the local attention during this election year is focused on candidates running for the state legislature, Board of County Commissioners (BoCC), county office holders and county school board. But there are many more city and community offices up for election this November. These positions are specific to geographic areas or governmental function.

Standing for an elected community position is an excellent way to dip your toe into running for a political office and becoming involved in local issues. A list of positions up for election in 2024 can be found on the Manatee County Supervisor of Elections (SOE) website at <a href="https://www.votemanatee.com/Candidate-Information/Offices-Up-For-Election">https://www.votemanatee.com/Candidate-Information/Offices-Up-For-Election</a>.

Filing fees for candidates running for city offices in Manatee County range from \$48 for Bradenton Beach city commissioner to \$757.65 for candidates running for Mayor of the City of Bradenton. Special taxing districts, such as community development districts (CDD) and fire districts, only require a filing fee of \$25. All candidates must also submit required documents outlined in the County Candidate Qualifying Handbook located on the SOE website at

https://www.votemanatee.com/Portals/Manatee/2024%20Candidate%20Qualifying%20Handbook%20Rev.%2004-23-24.pdf.

The deadline to qualify for office is noon on Friday, June 14.


