Democrats on the August 23 Ballot

The August 23 primary and school board elections are just around the corner, and early voting in Manatee County is already underway (August 13 to August 20). All elections are important, including the primaries.



So, get out and vote! Democracy depends on you!

In the primary, voters can choose candidates for state and national offices who will run against Republicans in the general election November 8.

The school board race is different. It is non-partisan, and candidates are not officially identified by political party. A candidate in the August 23 school board election must get more than 50 percent of the vote to retain or gain a seat on the school board. If no candidate gets 50 percent or more in the August 23 election, the two top vote-getters have a run-off in the November 8 general election.

Here are the Democratic candidates running for state, national and local offices in the August 23 primary, listed in alphabetical order by last name:


Say Gay Party Scheduled for September

County Opens Five Early Voting Centers



Manatee County allows voters to cast their ballot prior to Election Day, August 23, at any of the five designated Early Voting Centers. The Early Voting Centers are now open from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. through Saturday, August 20. Bring a valid and current photo and signature ID when you vote.

Vote-By-Mail ballots may be dropped into secure outside ballot boxes at all Early Voting sites during regular hours of operation.

Several Ways to Vote in the Upcoming Elections

Vote from Home: If you enrolled in the county's Vote-By-Mail system, you

should have received your ballot by late July. Your job now is to follow the instructions and complete your ballot. You can return it by mail to the Supervisor of Elections so long as it will be received by 7 p.m. on Election Day, August 23. You can track receipt of your ballot onlinehere.

Or, drop your Vote-By-Mail ballot into the convenient, outside drop box at an early voting site (during regular hours of operation) and up to 7 p.m. on election day at the Supervisor of Elections office, 600 301 Blvd. West, Bradenton.



As an alternative, take your Vote-By-Mail ballot to your polling place and surrender it to one of the clerks; you will be given a fresh ballot to vote in person.

Early Voting: Early voting sites opened August 13 and early voting continues throughSaturday, August 20. Go to any Manatee County Early Voting site from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Find location detailshere.

Election Day Aug. 23: Go to your voting precinct location, 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Find your voting precinct and sample ballot here. Be sure to check on your voting location, as some have changed.

Your vote is your power. Vote in the school board and primary elections. Election Day is August 23, but you can avoid the lines and traffic by voting from home or casting your ballot during Early Voting.

Lit Drops, Postcards Help Get Out the Vote



By Tim Eiseler—I want to remind everyone that the Manatee County Democratic Party office is well organized with literature drop information for the District 2 School Board race and postcards for Get Out the Vote.

Kate and I did both and it's all pretty easy. The lit drops and postcard mailing is going on now in preparation of the August 23 school board and primary elections. As you know, Vote-by-Mail ballots have been sent and many have already been returned.

You can pick up literature and postcards at the Manatee Democratic Headquarters, 435 Cortez Road West, Bradenton, Monday through Friday, noon to 4 p.m.

For lit drops, the office staff have bags filled with literature. They provide an address list of registered Democrats and two information cards. You go out in teams of two, a driver and runner. The team drives to the designated neighborhood and the runner leaves the literature bag on doorsteps. No door knocking. Not like canvassing. The process took us about an hour.

Mailing Democratic postcards is easy. You receive an address list and a packet of blank postcards. You are asked to donate the postage at 44 cents per card and that comes out to \$13.20 a pack. Sign a form saying you are making the donation of postage. You hand write the address, a salutation and short personal message on the cards and drop them in the mail.

Drop Off Literature for School Board Candidate

Engaged Democrats are dropping literature for Harold Byrd, candidate for the School Board in District 2, and encouraging Democrats to vote whether by mail, during early voting or on Primary Election Day, August 23.

Stop by Democratic headquarters, 435 Cortez Road, Bradenton, and pick up a

walk list and drop-off literature. Manatee Dems' HQ office is open Monday through Friday, noon to 4 p.m. and Saturdays, 4 to 6 p.m.

The walk lists are in School Board District 2, which is located in Palmetto and Bradenton. We suggest leaving the literature at each address on the walk list and no knocking on doors.
