

Legislative Session Halfway Through



By Nancy Hughes (Feb. 9, 2022) – The Florida State Legislature is about half-way through its 2022 session and some progress was made on redistricting and the budget. Most bills, however, are still in committee.

Both houses of the legislature passed maps that altered the districts in Manatee County. How that will affect Republican incumbents remains to be seen.

Democratic Rep. Michele Rayner, who represented an area that included Palmetto and Bradenton, had her district split and given to three other districts. The House map would keep the same number of minority-majority House seats, even though Florida's minority population increased by two million people in the past 10 years.

Rev. Golden will discuss legislation the school board initiated to include voter education in civics classes and other efforts to prepare graduates to be informed voters and engaged citizens.

Joining Rev. Golden will be Carolyn Sheets, Voter Services Chair of LWVMC. She will cover voter participation in Manatee County and compare the county with state and national voters.

Frank Alcock, professor of political science at New College, is scheduled to speak on pro-voter policies and practices that America can use to improve voter participation.
