a horse or a buffalo?



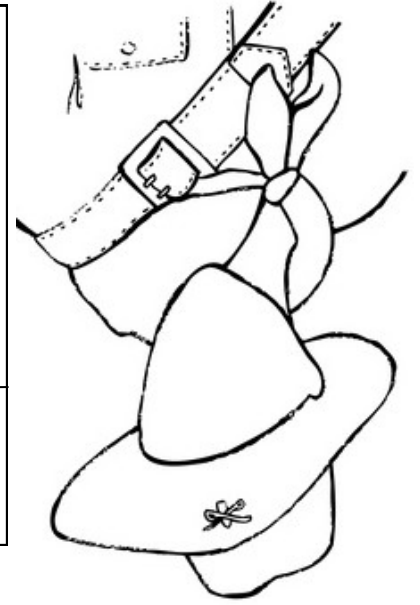
The nickname, "Buffalo Soldier" began with the
Cheyenne warriors. Some historians say the
name was given out of respect with their dark
curly hair like a buffalo and for their fierce
fighting abilities. They were a group of Black

25th Infantry. Some lived at Camp Little in
Nogales, Arizona.
