Estate Improvements – Hackney BC to conduct estate walkabout on Friday 29th September to discuss external improvements like signage and run down areas, to ascertain a programme of major works for every block in Hackney to be improved over the next seven years. Hackney will inform residents via newsletters and on website.

An external company will be contracted to deep clean the estate including blocks and walkways. There are plans to bring up standards on the estate and monitor it closely with penalties for failure and sickness culture amongst cleaners.

There are plans for costings, briefs, implementation, washing bin chambers, staffing and supervisory issues. Objections were raised to paying for deep clean but advised to keep positive as due on 30th October. Issues raised of dark lighting behind blocks attracting anti-social congregations.

Action Point – job description for cleaners to be displayed in newsletter / website stating what is expected from cleaners.

7 Accounts

Ying Hoang from Appleby & Wood presented and summarised an extract from the annual accounts 2022/23 including the income and expenditure, balance sheet and detailed income and expenditure accounts year end 31st March 2023 for which the full document is available to the board upon request.

Income up by £10,164. General reserve £432,353. Contingency £158,799. Total accumulated funds £591,152. Liquidity £635,195 over 12 months = £52k/month. Running costs are within guidelines and financials are all OK.
