
I just finished a good book: Here I Stand, a Life of Martin Luther, by Roland H. Bainton. It is an excellent book, and I heartily recommend it. Luther was an Augustinian Monk and ordained a Priest. However, he eventually left the monastery in the belief that a man "is justified by faith in Jesus Christ," and not by leading the austere life of a Monk. He preached Romans 1.17: "The righteous will live by faith." He protested the practices of the Christian Church in Rome and especially the practices of selling indulgences (i.e. pardons for sins). Martin was excommunicated by Pope Leo X in 1521. He led what is today called, "The Protestant Reformation," that eventually led to the founding of a new church: Lutheranism. In fact, all Christian churches today that are not Roman Catholic or Orthodox, are properly called Protestant.

Martin Luther was a preacher and a teacher. He earned a doctorate in theology and served as professor of theology at the University of Wittenberg in Germany until the day he died (1546). His translation of the Bible into German is hailed as a literary masterpiece. He was also fluent in the art of music, and his hymns are still sung in churches today all over the world. Luther's best-known hymn is "A Mighty Fortress is Our God," found on p. 23 in our hymnal. This is what Martin Luther had to say about music:

"Music is to be praised as second only to the Word of God because by her are all the emotions swayed. This precious gift has been bestowed on men alone to remind them that they are created to praise and magnify the Lord.

But when natural music is sharpened and polished by art, then one begins to see with amazement the great and perfect wisdom of God in his wonderful work of music, where one voice takes a simple part and around it sing three, four, or five other voices, leaping, springing round about, marvelously gracing the simple part, like a square dance in heaven with friendly bows, embracings, and hearty swinging of the partners. He who does not find this an inexpressible miracle of the Lord is truly a clod and is not worthy to be considered a man."

Luther sure had a way with words, and he was quick to let you know what he thought. I admire him and I heartily recommend the book: <u>Here I Stand</u>, a <u>Life of Martin Luther</u>.








