

I am remin ded of a story I read a long time ago. I have never forgotten it an d I would like to share it with you.

Shortly after [Dallas] Seminary was foun ded in 1924, it almost folded. It came to the point of bankruptcy. All the creditors were ready to foreclose at twelve noon on a particular day. That morning, the foun ders of the school met in the president's office to pray that God would provide. In that prayer meeting was Harry Ironside. When it was his turn to pray, he said in his refreshingly can did way, "Lord we know that the cattle on a thousan dhills are Thine. Please sell some of them and sen dus the money."

Just about that time, a tall Texan in boots an d an open-collar shirt strolled into the business office. "Howdy!" he said to the secretary. "I just sold two carloads of cattle over in Fort Worth. I've been trying to make a business deal go through, but it just won't work. I feel God wants me to give this money to the seminary. I don't know if you need it or not, but here's the check," an d he han ded it over.

The secretary took the check an d, knowing something of the critical nature of the hour, went to the door of the prayer meeting an d timidly tapped. Dr. Lewis Sperry Chafer, the foun der an d president of the school, answered the door an d took the check from her han d. When he looked at the amount, it was for the exact sum of the debt. Then he recognized the name on the check as that of the cattleman. Turning to Dr. Ironside, he said, "Harry, God sold the cattle."

## Smoky Mountain Methodist Church Council Meeting May 1, 2025

### **HIGHLIGHTS**



Pastor's Report

Rev Parker Benson said the 4/27/2025 meeting with the congregation about the new building was excellent and feels like in general all are embracing the plan.

Brochures will be distributed to each church member containing church plans and financing, including pledge cards. Members are to return their pledge cards on June 1<sup>st</sup> (Consecration Sunday), or directly to the church. Members also have an option to donate asset-based funds to the building fund; Mark Woelke will speak to those interested in this option. On Father's Day (Sunday June 15, 2025) Mark Woelke will inform the membership of the results of collected pledges.

The Evangelism Team distributed 160 door hangers in the neighborhood near SMMC church, inviting residents to attend Easter Sunday celebrations with us. The Team will continue this outreach at other times during the year.

Rev Ken Tucker (Wears Valley United Methodist Church) is giving SMMC their old church sign. Steve McGee will look into securing and installing this sign.

### **Finance Report**

Mark Woelke presented financial information as of April 2025

Tithes and donations: April: \$23,959 (budget \$22,000); year-to-date: \$106,457 (budget \$88,000). Operating expenses: April: \$39,201 (budget \$20,629); Year-to-date: \$59,938 (\$76,074 budget) \*\*

Available cash for the building fund: \$679,592

Surplus cash year-to-date: \$47,000 SMMC has no debt as of March 2025

G Lybrand informed Council that the GMC Annual Conference Mission Offering has reached out for financial help. The goal is to help other Global Methodists around the world to develop self-sufficient annual conferences. The suggested contribution of \$10 per member/average attendance was unanimously accepted by Council (\$800 total).

Council unanimously agreed to again subscribe to the legal services provided by the National Center for Liberty & Life; a flat fee of \$1,000 per year gives SMMC unlimited access to their services.

Council agreed to sign a contact with Pathway Grant Consultants to provide a list of funding options for SMMC's new building project. The cost is a flat fee of \$800.

#### SPPR

Bonnie Van Pelt informed Council that the search for an Associate Pastor is ongoing and all are hoping for positive results.

## **MOTION** – B Van Pelt

Increase the budget for the Associate Pastor from \$60,000 to \$70,000, with the stipulation that the extra salary will compensate for the Associate Pastor's work on all our social media. In addition, the Associate Pastor will be given a \$500 reimbursement for moving expenses, and \$2,000 for any expenses related to out-of-pocket for youth programs.

SECOND: Steve McGee

Council voted unanimously to accept the motion.

### Items from the Chair - New Church Project

Presentation and discussion of two contractors offering estimates for construction of Phase I. Of these two, DBB Construction of Friendsville, TN, has been very responsive to SMMC throughout the process and proactive to the needs of SMMC. References for DBB Construction include their extensive work at Eagle Rock.

### **MOTION** - G Lybrand

To formally hire DBB Construction as the contractor for SMMC's new building project, Phase I.

SECOND: Steve McGee

Council unanimously agreed to pursue a contract with DBB Construction.
