Also, three calves and one bull. And a donkey. I fed them all. I went out at daybreak (currently 7:00 a.m.), and first let the chickens out of their coop. Carol has two coops: one for the big chickens and one for the little chickens. They all run around in one chicken lot, which is fenced in. In the afternoon we let them out of the lot, and they run around the yard, the pastures, and the fields – free range. When it gets dark, they all go back into their respective coops automatically. All you have to do is go up there

and close the doors on the coops and shut the gate to the lot. Pretty neat.

This morning, I fed all the cows. We have five cows and a heifer.

Then I fed all the cows. The feed is in 55-gallon barrels. When they get empty, I load them in the back of the truck and drive to CO-OP on South 411 and get them filled. You have to pull up on the scales and get weighed; then you pull around to the feed silo, and they fill them up; then you drive around and get weighed again and then go in and pay. The four barrels of feed will last about a month because I don't feed them every day. I only feed them so that when I need the cows to go in a certain pasture or corral, I can put feed in a bucket, and they will follow me. Farmers say, "A cow will sell its soul for a bucket of feed." But you have to feed them from time to time just to keep them healthy and somewhat docile so they will follow you.

"Today at noon, a man is bringing us another heifer – called a "replacement heifer," to replace cows we recently sold. We sold three recently because they were getting old, too old to calve, and we have to replace them with a heifer. A heifer – BTW – is a cow that has never had a calf. Once she has a calf, she is properly called a cow. Until then she is a heifer.

What," you may ask, "does this have to do with church?" Good question. Possible nothing, but the Bible does say, "A righteous man cares for the needs of his animal." (Proverbs 12:10) So, I do. The same as you do when you feed your cat or your dog or your goldfish.

And Jesus is the Good Shepherd.


