**Spring** is a wonderful time when we celebrate new life and the resurrection of Jesus Christ our Lord. It is Easter and the time when we remember his empty tomb and marvel at his appearance to Mary and the others on that first Easter morn. Christ is our risen Savior, the "first fruits" of those who die and rise again.

To many people Easter is an unbelievable event: "How can one rise from the dead?" But I would respond, "How can one be alive in the first place?" All of life is a miracle.

Oh, that's crazy, "some might say. "I don't believe it."



#### Pastor's Report

Rev Benson addressed a possible concern about low attendance this year and speculates much of it is due to illness, weather, and vacations. SMMC has 2 prospective members and Parker has been in touch with them.

#### Finance Report

Debbie Cummings reported the following as of February 2025:

- Tithes and donations \$41,926 (\$2.1K less than target)
- Operating expenses \$14,128 (\$22,900 below planned expenses)
- Available cash for the building fund \$696,045 (increase of \$25K since February)
- SMMC has no debt as of 3/6/2025

#### Trustee Report

Steve McGee said a window leak near the fireplace is repaired, but the chimney awaits a permanent fix. The road signs will be erected as soon as the SMMC project design plans are completed.

#### SPPR

Bonnie VanPelt circulated the financial package for the pending Associate Pastor position; and indicated the new job description has been posted to the websites of Asbury and Truett seminaries; awaiting the OK from Wesley and United seminaries to post on their websites. although nothing has been posted yet. An applicant who initially was not interested in the position recently contacted Rev Benson and an interview is pending.

#### Outreach Committee

Larry Campbell will temporarily take over managing the website since Paulette Bailey stepped down. SMMC is now looking for an individual to take over the responsibilities permanently. Paulette created a "how to" document before she left

George Lybrand distributed a document which outlines the procedure to follow when requesting help from Audry Pettis, particularly when needing printing and copying.

Sandy Lybrand and other members of the SMMC Project Committee met with Don Shell, Architect, to go over his latest site and floor plans. Don is still waiting for Bill Wilson to indicate where the septic field will be located so the design can be finalized (SMMC has permission for the septic).

Last month members of SMMC Council offered their ideas on "growing the church" by filling out a survey; G Lybrand thanked everyone for their input and briefly touched on some of the results he compiled. Since there is so









#### **Four Qualities God Blesses**

(Based on the book of Daniel, who knew that eating the royals food was not God's best for him).

- 2. **Discipline:** He controlled his ego and his appetite. Just because Daniel could do something, doesn't mean he should do it.




