



1a. How long have you lived in Tennessee? I left TN in 1977 to attend college and returned home to "God's country" in 2016 after I retired.


2. Name something unique about you that very few people know. I sang a solo in Washington, DC in celebration of our country's bicentennial.

3. What is the hobby that you are most passionate about today? Traveling, reading and just being out in our beautiful mountains.


4. What qualities do you admire most in others? Honesty, integrity, and happiness.

4. What qualities do you admire most in others? *Sincerity and humor.*







Council Meeting December 5, 2024



HIGHLIGHTS



Changes in Council Membership

George Lybrand welcomed Marsha McPherson and Randy Trentham as new members of the Council. These individuals will replace John Urban and Gerald Smith, whose terms have expired.

Bonnie VanPelt will remain on the Council as Chair of SPPR.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Benson recently paid a visit to Pathways Church (Sevierville) at the request of Dave and Sandy Tubbs to look over the church's very successful young peoples after school activity center. Rev Benson thinks SMGMC might be able to use this as a model going forward.

Kristine Brock is arranging a Sunday school class beginning in January 2025; it will be available for 6 months and if successful will continue. Kristine indicated it would be beneficial to offer childcare during Sunday school; a motion was made at the Council meeting and unanimously accepted to offer Kora, our current babysitter, another hour on Sundays.

SMGMC has a newly designed website; members are urged to check it out and offer comments to Paulette Bailey.

Finance Report

Operating expenses: Expenses were \$6,600 under budget for November, and \$40,400 under budget for the year. The benevolence committee raised about \$10,000 more than was budgeted for the year.

Tithes and donations: \$28,000 over budget for November, \$110,000 over budget for the year.

Building fund available cash: \$637,000 available (increased by \$36,000 in November)

SPPR

Bonnie VanPelt will follow up with any applicants for Assistant Pastor. The number of new Global Methodist Churches is causing a shortage of ministers; Council members raised the possibility of sponsoring an individual to attend seminary in exchange for a two-year commitment with SMGMC.

Items from the Chair

The Mid-South Conference spent almost \$.25M in disaster relief as a result of the Helene storm damage this year. They are rebuilding homes and staff is onsite to assist those in need.

Survey work has begun on the church project; a report is expected the beginning of January 2025 regarding need to move dirt around, take down trees, address powerlines, soil testing, etc.
