We would like to express our heartfelt appreciation to our donors, partners, and volunteers. We are deeply grateful for your contributions and commitment to our mission




MESSAGE FROM OUR LEADER

The Funding

We will continue our mission to support underrepresented communities of color and address youth violence in District 1 neighborhoods of Palm Springs and the immediate region. YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULTS

The goal is to provide a positive, safe, and nurturing environment for growth service, and expression for all youth aged 10-18 and young adults 19-24, especially those in underserved communities and communities of color.

SOCIAL ENTERPRISE AND EMPLOYMENT

We aim to increase economic opportunity in the community by preparing individuals for success in the workplace, meaningful careers and economic prosperity. We believe that one of the best ways to find a job is through networking.

COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLNESS PROGRAMS

These programs will harness technology to provide youth with mental health resources and skills to navigate and reduce adverse experiences. We plan on working on challenges caused by language barriers, cultural stigmas or lack of trust.



YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULTS

Our comprehensive mental health programs aim to ensure that all youth have access to the resources they need to support their mental health wellness. By prioritizing mental health and working to reduce the stigma associated with seeking support, we are empowering young people to prioritize their well-being and lead healthy, fulfilling lives.

COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLNESS PROGRAMS

Our current initiatives include Circle of Friends, and in the near future, we will be opening Parents Learning Walk, an open group session dedicated to dealing with post-COVID-19 stress on families and its impact in our communities. Our Mental Health Program will operate together with the WAOU Employment & Social Enterprise Intervention Program under the SEECER Center. Our goal is to foster emotional well-being and resilience within our community.





VIRTUAL CAFÉS

Our Virtual Community Cafés took place every Wednesday from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM, offering a unique opportunity for community members to gather, listen, and connect. We covered a wide range of essential topics, including mental health, cultural diversity, careers, technology, and sustainability. Throughout our journey, we successfully organized over 30 Virtual Cafés, featuring 35 professionals sharing their expertise with an eager audience. We are delighted to have participants joining us from the East Coast, Mexico City, and Sri Lanka. All our past Cafés are accessible on our official YouTube Channel.



FUTURE PLANS FOR VIRTUAL CAFÉS

In the future, we aim to enhance our Virtual Café, making it a more professional and interactive experience. Currently, we are searching for a studio to meet our recording needs and plan to invite speakers from all over Riverside County. Our goal is to create an inclusive space on our blog and social media, sharing positive news that can positively impact our community, as we believe in the life-saving power of good news.

The new Virtual Cafés will be an inclusive space to discuss, learn, meet experts, or plan how to make our community a safe and progressive place to live in.



YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULTS

We are dedicated to cultivating new leaders and fostering positive youth development, equipping youth with the necessary skills and opportunities to thrive and make a meaningful impact in their communities. To achieve this goal, we have implemented a framework that incorporates the principles of developmental assets and methodology utilizing developmental relationships, which are strongly supported by the Search Institute. Through this approach, we have identified activities that keep youth engaged, while providing them with the necessary skills.

THE FUTURE

We Are One United's future youth development plans include a 2023 Youth Summer Camp for disadvantaged youth in the Palm Springs area. This also includes Youth Council, Summer Youth Employment Program, Youth Theatre, Arts, Culture, Media, and Production Company, VELA Black Youth Development Program, Out of School Time Program in August/September 2023, Youth College Collaboration, COD Internship, Inter-generational Mentoring Program, and STEM program.



COMMUNITY WELLNESS

Our organization aims to empower the community to determine its own destiny by building capabilities and relationships, evaluating the impact of COVID-19, prioritizing physical and mental health, ensuring access to programs and services, and expanding our reach by partnering with existing community organizations.

THE FUTURE

Under our Community Wellness program, we have various planned programs, including community gardening, local BBQs, and mixers aimed at building better relationships. These programs also aim to teach and model mediation, negotiation, and reconciliation practices. Additionally, we have engagement plans to bring all communities together, with a focus on arts and culture. We will be partnering with organizations such as Bayanihan Desert, Advancing Steps, DeAtzlan Consulting, Urban Palm Springs, James O. Jesse Community Center, BRAAF, and James Woods as "Dat Yoga Dude." Moreover, we aim to connect with different communities and address issues related to policing, homelessness, and hunger.





COMMUNITY BACKPACK GIVEAWAY

In 2021 and 2022, thanks to our friends at James O. Jesse Desert Highland Unity Center in Palm Springs and Cabot Yerxa Elementary School in Desert Hot Springs, we had the opportunity to participate in two Backpack Giveaways.

In addition to providing necessary school supplies, we aimed to create a fun and engaging experience for the kids and their parents. That's why we set up a craft table where they could make adorable bookmarks together. We also conducted a Community Survey, and as a token of appreciation for those who participated, we gave away \$25 gift cards.



REMEMBERING 9/11

On the September 11 National Day of Service and Remembrance, we invited people to James O. Jessie Desert Highland Unity Center to come together in service to honor those lost and those whose lives were forever changed that fateful day. We had the privilege to host amazing speakers, such as René Brown, Scott Nevins, Nancy Irbin, and Grace Garner.

This event was organized thanks to AmeriCorps, the federal agency for volunteerism and national service in remembrance of fallen lives. We were grateful for the opportunity to create a space for reflection, community building, and service.





COMMUNITY LEADERS SUMMIT

The Community Leaders Summit is a vital event that aims to connect us with leaders and community members to discuss initiatives and ensure that we continue to build strong relationships in our community. We host quarterly summits and have successfully held them in September 2022, January 2023 and in Desert Hot Springs on April 24th and May 22nd.

Guests such as BRAAF, Chase Bank, Police Chief Andrew Mills, and Palm Springs Mayor Grace Garner have attended these summits, along with our board who contributed to a highly engaging and productive event. We plan to hold future meetings in cities throughout Riverside County.



SOCIAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND JOB NETWORKING

Our organization is dedicated to increasing economic opportunity in the community by preparing individuals for success in the social enterprise development of businesses and in the workplace. We firmly believe that one of the most effective ways to succeed is through entrepreneurship and networking. As part of this, we organized a Career Fair on March 30th to facilitate valuable networking opportunities for the local community.

THE FUTURE

Our Job and Business Club Initiative will provide interview and resume support, guidance on dressing for success, and access to resources from partners such as Advancing Steps or Chase Bank. Additionally, our SEECER Center will collaborate with small businesses and entrepreneurs to create jobs and expand opportunities for job seekers in our club, while also offering business development classes in English and Spanish through a partnership with Get In Motion. Finally, we plan to explore job opportunities with partners like IBEW, Riverside County Black Chamber of Commerce, Riverside Greater Chamber of Commerce, and The Hispanic Chamber of Commerce Coachella Valley.

Working in unison, they are fully dedicated to effectively report and manage our awarded grants and continuously seek local funding opportunities. To optimize our donor management capabilities, we are thrilled to introduce DonorPerfect as our new platform, streamlining communication, reporting, and engagement with our supporters. Their work is driven by their unwavering commitment to secure the necessary resources to fund operations and develop our community driven programming.





COMMUNITY RESOURCE SPECIALIST TEAM

We're thrilled to introduce our Community Resource Specialist (CRS) Team – a group of talented individuals of all ages, ready to help with our organization's programming and research. Not only are they the friendly faces you'll see in the community, but they are dedicated specialists who are passionate about making a positive impact. We meet twice a week in person, at College of the Desert - Palm Springs, and online on Thursday evenings. We plan, we discuss and we try to understand different point of views. We don't shy away from difficult topics such as racism in education, mental health, homelessness, youth at risk, or the foster care system. That's why we invite local professionals, from organizations such as SafeHouse of the Desert, Learn For Life, DeAztlan Consulting, BRAAF, or local professionals like James Woods, Deiter Crawford, Cynthia Sessions and Phillip Frazier to share their knowledge with us.

According to John Epps, the CRS Team goal is: "We hope this can help us identify resources, opportunities, and jobs in the local economy and help build wealth in the community".





HOW WE USE DATA: MEET THE DATA TEAM

One of our major accomplishments has been the establishment of the Data Team in February 2023 as part of a data project aimed at assessing the covariates of violence and violence mitigation in the District 1 community in Palm Springs, California. The Data Team, which comprises of Augustine Kposowa PhD, Mihiri Chandrasena MHI, and Charlie Carrera, is an integral part of the Community Resources Specialist Team. The team meets at the College of the Desert Campus in Palm Springs on Tuesdays and Thursdays, as well as virtually as needed.

We are a recipient of the ESRI nonprofit grant, granting us access to their Arc GIS software for two years, which we'll use to aid our community. Our team built their first survey at the Career Fair, contacted SAS, SPSS, and ESRI for data management and analysis tools, and obtained a SAS/STATS version 9.4 license. We constructed a quantitative instrument and gathered feedback from focus groups to adhere to the grant's principles. We're currently conducting a literature review to design effective interventions to reduce violence and promote safety.

OUR PROGRAM GOALS FOR 2024

We have exciting plans to expand our impact and provide more support to families and children in the community, including launching a high school program that offers childcare for teen parents in 2023 and launching an AmeriCorps program in 2024. We aim to start providing small-scale services for families in our programs through our partnership with the Early Learning Consortium in Riverside and membership in the Coachella Valley planning committee. We are also exploring international partnerships with ITT Africa and BOCA International (Bocas Hospitality Project) in 2024 to gain valuable international cooperation.

OUR FUNDRAISING GOALS

We are building on our growing list of key stakeholders and volunteers. Our upcoming efforts include ongoing community leaders summit meetings, special events like an orientation luncheon to introduce potential supporters to our organization, and community-focused gatherings, activities and engagements that will provide opportunities to ask for more support. For instance, we are building partnerships with the assistance and guidance of those who have made inroads into community building by connecting with leaders, advocates, allies, and talent in our communities.
