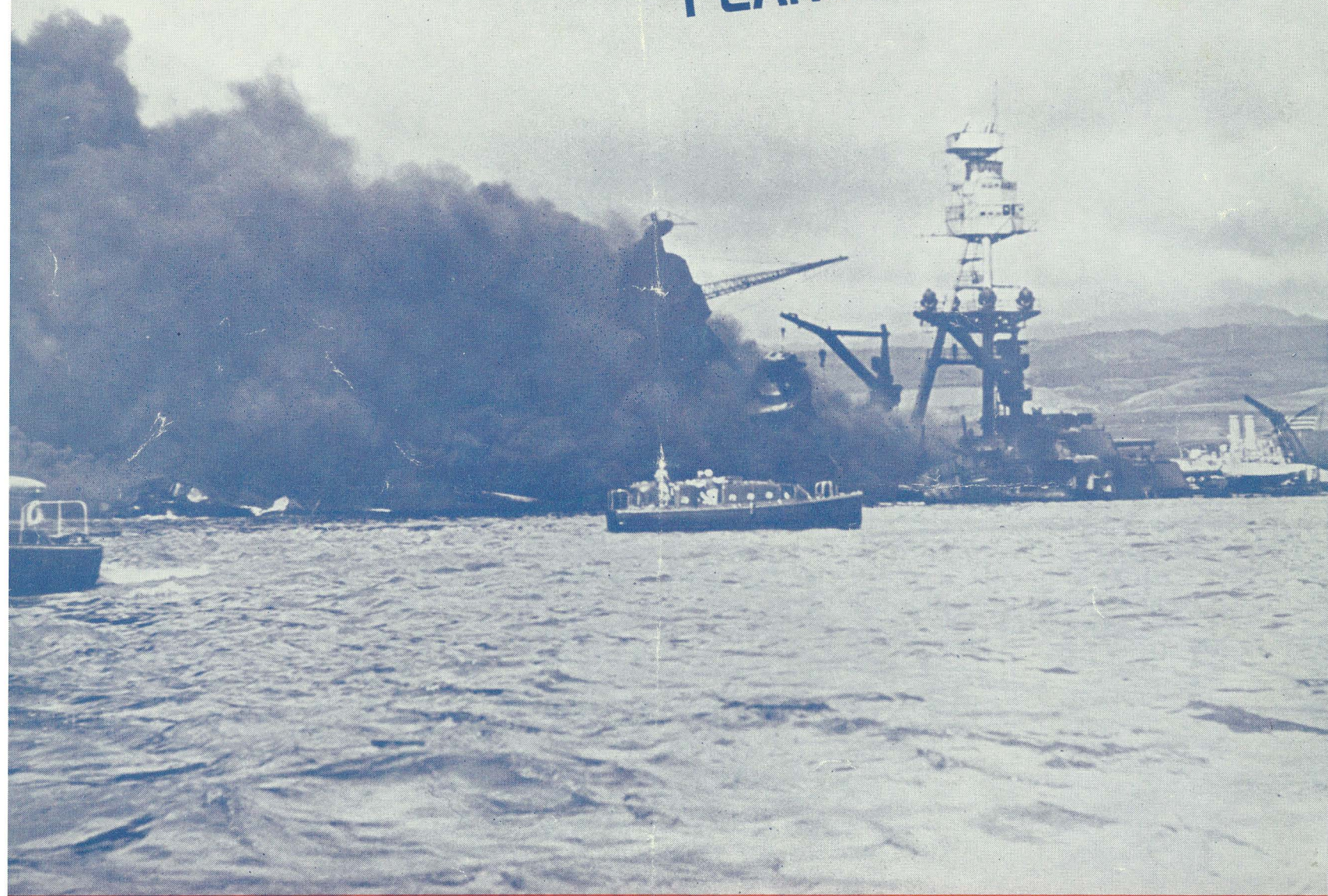

We at Scintilla do not need to be responsible for the lives of those who are at the battle lines. But we DO need to know that production is precious. That production is vital to our winning this war.

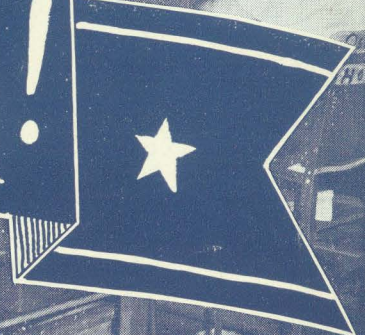
The Axis gangsters hope we will lose. Every piece scrapped, every minute lost gives them a victory.
