Class Days: Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays

Volunteer Days: Thursdays (Students will assist with grading, organizing, mentoring, classroom support, or

Quarter 1 Projects & Special Assignments

Quarter Project: Personal Calling Poster Presentation

- Description: Students will design a poster or digital board that creatively showcases their gifts, personality traits, career interests, spiritual calling, and future goals.
- Goal: Encourage reflection on identity and purpose in God's plan.

Special Assignment 1: Passion Reflection Essay

- Description: Write a 500-word essay exploring what you're passionate about, how it relates to your faith, and how it might align with your career path.
- Goal: Tie in purpose, personality, and calling.

Special Assignment 2: College Comparison Matrix

- Description: Create a comparison chart evaluating 3 colleges based on factors like location, cost, size, programs, spiritual life, and more.
- Goal: Practice informed decision-making and personal alignment.

Quarter 2 Projects & Special Assignments

Quarter Project: College Essay Portfolio

- Description: Submit a polished college application essay, revised drafts, feedback notes, and a short reflection on the process.
- Goal: Build a writing portfolio ready for real applications.

Special Assignment 1: Résumé Draft & Peer Review

- Description: Create a professional résumé with feedback from classmates. Include extracurriculars, volunteer work, and honors.
- Goal: Teach résumé formatting and peer review skills.

Special Assignment 2: Recommendation Request Simulation

- Description: Write a mock email requesting a letter of recommendation from a teacher or mentor. Include background info and why you're asking them.
- Goal: Practice professional communication.

Quarter 3 Projects & Special Assignments

Quarter Project: "Life in a Dorm" Simulation Presentation

- Description: Create a visual or live presentation of your ideal dorm setup, daily routine, meal plans, budgeting hacks, and social boundaries.
- Goal: Teach practical independence and self-management.

Special Assignment 1: College Budget Plan Worksheet

- Description: Fill out a realistic monthly budget based on actual college expenses (use FAFSA estimators or sample data).
- Goal: Build financial literacy.

Special Assignment 2: Social Media Audit

- Description: Audit your social media for professionalism and submit a before/after summary.
- Goal: Promote digital maturity and online self-awareness.

Quarter 4 Projects & Special Assignments

Quarter Project: Capstone Portfolio & Presentation

- Description: Present your completed college prep portfolio: essay, résumé, devotion plan, college choices, calling poster, mock application, and reflection.
- Goal: Showcase readiness and growth.

Special Assignment 1: Devotional Plan for College Life

- Description: Design a personal devotional plan (weekly or daily) using Scripture, prayer prompts, and goals for spiritual growth during college.
- Goal: Foster spiritual independence.

Special Assignment 2: Worldview Debate Response Essay

- Description: Choose a cultural or political topic relevant to college campuses. Write an essay presenting both sides and your reasoned response through a biblical lens.
- Goal: Strengthen critical thinking and respectful engagement.
