September 6, 2022 Meeting Minutes

- Call to Order: President Tom Kautz called the meeting to order at 6 p.m.
- Introduction of New Members/Visitors: None present.
- Treasurer Report (Rosie Kautz): The beginning balance for August 2022 was \$5,641.15, and the ending balance was \$5,646.95. Total deposits were \$1,085.00 that included the Chili Mania payment of \$900.00. The major expense was \$900.00 for the rental of the Craig Center. The club also paid First Lutheran Church \$100.00 for four months of rent.
- Additions/Corrections to August's newsletter: No additions/corrections were offered.
- Web Site Report (Mike Hughbanks): No report. Mike Hughbanks absent.
- Illness/Sunshine Report (Rosie Kautz): A get well card was sent to Vern Morris.

Old Business

- Woodcarvers' Supply Crib at Show (Tom Kautz/Jim Trumpy): Good quality used carving tools are
 needed for the table. Rosie Kautz said she would send out an email reminder to the club members
 before the show. Rosie also clarified that the club would receive 10 percent of the total sales from
 the table. Jim Trumpy questioned whether the club really needed the money from the crib table.
 Tom Kautz said the club is currently solvent, but it is wise to bring in money as able, because there
 are a lot of future unknowns for the club. The Madison club will also be donating 10% of their sales
 according to Jim.
- 2022 RRVC Show Update (Brad Crandall): Thirty-two exhibitors have signed up for the show. Forty-two tables are paid for, plus the wood vendor will need three to four tables. The set-up for the show will start at 2 p.m. on Friday, September 9th. Leaf blowers are needed for clean-up on Saturday after 4 p.m. Jim Trumpy will bring the Christmas tree for the ornament table. Mark Ludois will sell the ornaments. Reggie James and Steve Johnson are in charge of Peoples Choice. Hand sanitizer will be available at the Greeter's Table. The award for the miniatures category will be a \$25.00 check. The ribbon order should arrive in the next few days.
