#### **August 2, 2022 Meeting Minutes**

- Call to Order: President Tom Kautz called the meeting to order at 6 p.m.
- Introduction of New Members/Visitors None present
- Treasurer Report (Rosie Kautz): The June beginning balance was \$5,513.39 and the July ending balance was \$5,66.15. The deposits included \$100 in dues, a \$20 donation, and \$320 from show table sales. Expenses included \$75 Tallman Art Show and non-profit annual registration fees, \$28 newsletter ink, \$82 for our July picnic, and \$102 show related.
- Additions/Corrections to last month's newsletter: None were voiced.
- Web Site Report (Mike Hughbanks): Our site had 186 visitors over the past 30 days, giving it a total of 1,700 visits so far this year.
- Illness/Sunshine Report (Rosie Kautz): Thinking of You cards were sent to Dave Thill, and Leo Hansen. A sympathy card was sent to Pat Beggs. Get Well cards were sent to Gary Colby, Jim Trumpy, and Andy Navarro.

#### **Old Business**

- Woodcarvers' Supply Table at Show (Tom Kautz): Depending on demand, one or two tables at our show will sell used, but good carving items for club members with 10% of the selling price going to our club. Jim Trumpy volunteered to man the table(s). <u>Please let Jim know what you have to sell</u> soon, so we know how many tables will be needed.
- 2022 Show (Brad Crandall):
  - The fairgrounds are reserved for Sept. 8 (half day) and Sept. 9 (full day) for next year.
  - Kaufman's Market has had a few less attendees this year compared to last year. Upcoming dates are Aug. 20 and 27.
  - Contest rules were clarified: If you win 1 blue ribbon in a category at <u>any</u> show, you move up to the next category (novice, intermediate, open). Only 1 woodcarving category.
  - Brad is unable to get a chain saw carver for our show despite calling 10 individuals.
  - We still need more Christmas ornaments for our show.
