

## Vexyricon Synopsis

(Fixing *Everything, for Dummies*, v1.02)

-----=INTRO / MORAL REALITY=-----

**Absolute fairness is supposed to rule society**, nothing else.

Fairness can be defined as reaching "**equivalent exchange of pain and pleasure between individuals**".

**Absolute fairness can/should be found, for every conflict, by debating until it is found.** I call this a situation's "moral reality". **I've outlined the instructions to and confronted all arguments against this, in the Vexyricon.**

*Justifications (skip if in a hurry):*

- Every debate to find fairness, eventually gets **petty**. That's how you know you've **already found/gone past the fairest solution**. Because there are no more **non-petty** arguments against it. To judge if something is petty, all we need to do/can do is vote at an appropriate level. Using juries is also a tool, I could go on, there are many tools we can use. This is in our best interest, and humanity's best attempt at fairness.
- Our current court system already attempts to find fairness, but is running more on **money** than actually finding fairness (justice). It also cuts corners with the use of **blanket laws** that ignore the reality that fairness is found by **confronting all the valid details** of every conflict **individually** rather than just saying, for example: "if you do x action, you spend x years in prison **regardless of its justification**" (that's what a blanket law looks like). The nature of fairness itself involves **hearing out** any **valid** justifications **until the barrier of pettiness is reached** (the point when **any remaining arguments/justifications are just petty**, meaning we've now found the fairest solution we can).
- Ask yourself, is it better for humanity to; 1. Accept the nihilistic hopelessness and elusive increased division greedy elites at the top of this hellish society want to keep alive, by not trying to find **our best attempt at maximized fairness** in conflicts, saying "we can't find it because everyone's different" or whatever, or 2. Actually put forth effort to find and maximize fairness to the **best of humanity's ability** through the use of a **maximally organized system**, humanity's best attempt at fairness, to maximize fairness and unity in society? Because that, the second option, literally **enables the rest of the Vexyricon**, the rest of this **blueprint** for a literal **near utopia**. For god's sake, walk into a court room now and you'll see we've already **made**, albeit a corrupt, version of this exact organized system for finding fairness in conflicts. Get rid of the blanket laws, and implement the rest of the Vexyricon, and you'll have an uncorrupted, truly fairness-locating, maximally unifying system...

**fairness, is in everyone's best interest, in almost all scenarios.**

- The main **core problem** causing **all corruption** in society, is **people not being educated** on the **reality** that **fairness is in everyone's best interest in almost all scenarios**, and **exactly how/why that's reality**.

Once a person truly realizes that's **reality**, they will prioritize fairness highly; one may even say:

**“their human nature is now uncorrupted”.**

- The other core problem, is that people **don't have enough emotional attachment to this life and society** to shift their mindset from being “a temporary inhabitant **using society like a condom** for pleasure until death”, to “a permanent resident, **invested in making this** the fair (true), **best existence/society possible**”. We are **(too much%)** a society of unfair, selfish, hedonistic consumers, and **not (enough%)** a society of invested, true-fairness enforcing, inspired creators, builders; philosophers.

**The first part of the solution:** is for society to first: see how amazing things would be if we **were**; **by just reading this book and thus seeing how all its info connects. Just like the colors of the rainbow connect, these chapters do too; creating a much bigger, beautiful, extremely inspiring, connected picture.** Just like how all the colors of the rainbow connect, and are more beautiful seen **together, connected**, this book shares many different parts of a far more amazing **society** and how **they connect**. If you only understand **one chapter**, it's like seeing only **one color** of the rainbow. That's not as inspiring as seeing the whole rainbow; it won't motivate you enough.

**The second part of the solution:** is basic **human immortality (curing aging)**. Think about it. Using the first solution, people read the Vexyricon and realize how amazing society and life can be, **motivating** them to make all that a **reality**, and then now, **with aging cured**, they'd have an **opportunity** to make **all that last forever, to find the answers to every question in the universe,**

**experience literally all of life's potential?** That's definitely going to **increase the emotional investment/attachment** people have toward turning this into the **best existence possible**, **rather** than just using society/the planet like a condom selfishly, purposelessly, and hedonistically, until each of their "inevitable deaths" like too many currently do.

They'd all now be possible due to having unlimited time (**further** increasing the emotional investment everyone would have toward making this the **best existence possible** rather than milking pleasure **selfishly, unfairly and purposelessly** "**until your death**"). Fairness, creativity, and managing not to die in other ways, will be the only limits to your dreams.

-----ECONOMICS-----

("hybrid socialism")

- The physical, emotional, and mental health of each citizen is maintained by the government/collective society, free of charge, including education on fulfilling the major crucial parts of everyone's happiness (relationship mastery, conflict resolution/achieving justice, finding purpose, and much more).

- What isn't provided for free, is what is considered "**luxuries**": money earned from jobs is only for a "luxury" market, buying things not needed to be a more productive person, like a yacht, for example. **Things that genuinely make a citizen more healthy/productive should automatically be given to them, fairly.** And no, human connection mastery, fulfilling purpose, conflict resolution mastery, food, a modern, organized and efficient home etc. are not luxuries. They are necessities to create a maximally mentally healthy and productive individual. A yacht, or a slot machine in your house, or a pool, and many other things, **are** examples of luxuries.
- Productivity **will** automatically be high, through educating citizens on how to tap into their full motivation (the Vexyricon does this easily), having full **communication** and transparency about each citizen's job's necessity/importance in society, and making jobs the easiest, and most satisfying we can until technology can do the job for us (why would we call it a job if we truly wanted to do it).

Think about a competitive team on any video game. As the leader, you educate and train your teammates on how to be the best teammate and player they can, the most efficient. Things that don't boost their skill as a player, tend to be traded amongst themselves by bartering other valuable items, or money. So, this economy and society is like just one large team. Jobs amongst the team are divided according to player's

strengths and what positions are needed to be fulfilled, and in the same way: Jobs in this economy will just be temporary allocation of time and effort from each citizen in whatever area society needs maintenance in, the goal of jobs is that **they are just necessary to maintain society's stability, keep society healthy so that its people can spend the rest of their time off the clock, advancing** (doing things like **making robots that do these jobs for us making our lives better and easier**, or just having **fun** while not at work, or perhaps **figuring out this existence further** as a fair team motivated to achieve the best existence possible).

Work hours should never need to be overbearing, and if they are, that's a quest for society to just advance technology to fix that faster so robots can take the unfun work from us. On top of this, it's not hard to simply make an organized system of labor distribution that is fair and doesn't leave any group or individuals working with unfair hours or jobs. Just read the moral reality synopsis chapter and provide an argument against it if you think I'm wrong.

*Justifications (skip if in a hurry):*

Q: So who will take less desirable jobs that people hate?

A: Factors like the demand for the position, the level of difficulty of the job versus amount of pay etc., will determine the job's **desirability ranking**. Those who work more efficiently and just do better work will rank up to higher ranking jobs, and yes, can usurp others.

Q: What determines how much money people make from their jobs?

A: They'll be paid according to the necessity, difficulty, and value of the work they do.

Once again, **just find the moral reality.**

Q: What if I want to manage a Gucci store as my job?

A: Managing a Gucci store (luxury clothing store, etc.) will not count as an actual job.

That's something someone would do off the clock, because it doesn't contribute to maintaining society's actual infrastructure, stability, or health. It's literally a luxury store dude.

Q: How will price be determined and fairness on pricing be enforced?

A: Same way fairness will be enforced on any other issues. **By finding the moral reality.** Every citizen will be adept and trained in finding moral reality, but if they can't, meaning all their friends and family who'll try as well, it'll eventually just make its way to court.

Q: So what if I want to eat more food all of a sudden? How do I accomplish that?

A: You modify your online menu which replenishes your fridge weekly. It will have your own (ranked) list of your favorite foods, and whatever's highest ranked on your list and in stock, is sent, as long as the amount of food requested isn't above the limit. The limit is decided based on metrics like how much of it is in stock, and the projected incoming demand of it from others based on previous weeks, for example. Higher demand will likely cause new job positions to open up to create more of that food, and others to

close as their demand lessens as a result. That doesn't mean people will lose their job; it just means they'll likely move to another one. So, if you're trying to bulk for example (gain lots of muscle) and need many more calories all of a sudden, all you'd do is communicate that if for some reason your new request goes "over the limit". **The moral reality will be found**, and worst-case, the job market will likely just shift to start accommodating your updated caloric intake. Realistically though, society will keep a surplus of foods to handle things like this, so you likely won't reach the limit and have to wait for more of your food to be made to accommodate your larger diet. We just won't be in that tight of a position. Also, any food order we can't fulfill, we will let you know and send the next best item on your list. Everyone having a large list, will therefore likely prevent problems even further, as the surplus from those other items will be able to fulfill them too if their higher ranked items are out of stock...

Q: So, what if I need emergency brain surgery?

A: Of course, having trained brain surgeons on standby for emergencies like this as their job, is necessary.

Q: How will we have master brain surgeons who don't botch surgeries, if hypothetically, they're not needed for work very often? Won't their underused surgery skills become dull?

A: Their skills will likely be tested regularly, and they'll be paid upon passing the tests, ensuring their skills remain sharp, if this "lack of emergencies" actually happens.

Q: So what if I want a bigger house?

A: That's a luxury market item to save up for. The government will give you a nice, clean, modern apartment that won't be some slum, by default. But if you want some mansion, you'll need to make money for that.

Q: What will you do when AI/robots take all the jobs to the point no one has any money for luxuries? How will your luxury market even function then? How will anyone get a yacht?

A: 1. You can help others with jobs they need done personally for money. 2. Any jobs that appear which robots can't do will obviously be posted. 3. Advancing technology or making discoveries could perhaps be awarded with money instead of just something like a Nobel prize award, shifting our focus from societal maintenance-oriented (which robots now fulfill) to be higher-purpose-oriented, for rather fulfilling quests of advancing mankind's understanding of the universe, philosophy, or whatever. 4. Worst case, people can make money from intense competitive sports. But this won't happen. There are **always** things to explore physically and intellectually in this existence which man hasn't yet, main quests.

-----CENSORSHIP-----

**All censorship** is supposed to be based on the **individual conflict's moral reality (fairest assessment)** of **each individual conflict** it is requested in, **every time**. Always remember, blanket rules/laws are foundationally against fairness; they **cut corners** in finding **actual** fairness/moral reality. To censor anyone based on any blanket rule/law is no different. **Each individual situation has its own fairest assessment to find through debate until the barrier of pettiness is reached** (no valid/non petty arguments remain to challenge it).

-----THE JUDGEMENT LIST-----

With igniting songs, what matters is that your emotional state is a healthy enough one to **conduct** energy rather than sap it. The emotions of the song you listen to should mirror what emotions you're feeling. What they do is make you feel said emotions more strongly, and if you're in a state that can conduct energy rather than sap it, that's ignition. The extreme version of this, is energetic insanity.
