BBQ (especially with the large number of Scouts being fed).	Minor Burns	2	2	4	Scouts & adults serving.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Provide adults to keep the queue in order.</li> <li>2. Ensure cooking equipment is physically stable.</li> </ol>
Scouts returning to camping area.	Minor injuries	5	2	10	Scouts	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Some zone staff to stay on the zones during the evening.</li> </ol>
Dancing in the marquee	Minor injuries	1	3	3	Young People	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Boundaries to be set by the MC to control the Scouts.</li> <li>2. Additional adults in the marquee for general control.</li> </ol>
Ingress to and egress from the Ford Marquee	Minor injuries	1	5	5	Young People & Leaders	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Mark the Ford Marquee tent pegs and ropes with hazard tape or similar to make them obvious to people in the vicinity. [This risk is also covered on the camp site risk assessment.]2 x Adult Leaders per entrance / exit and 2 x adults inside marquee at all times.</li> </ol>
Camp Fire	Minor Injuries / Burns	1	2	4	Scouts ad adults serving	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Provide adults to keep the queue in order for s'mores etc</li> <li>2. Ensure equipment is physically stable / altar fire for s'mores only and not the main camp fire</li> <li>3. Rope off the main campfire and do not allow any young people near it.</li> <li>4. Designated route to and from campfire circle with adults monitoring at all times.</li> <li>5. No running or messing around when in the fire surround / circle.</li> </ol>

Low = 1, High = 5. Any risk greater than 5 requires method improvement / preventative measures.
