

Zone General Info

- Scout POR will be applied at all times.
- This is an **ALOCOHOL FREE** Camp and please ask for guidance if you are unsure on any element of the camp relating to Scouting POR.
- Young People arrive from 6:00pm to check-in and should report to Zone Leaders upon arrival after check-in has been completed. Please check that each Young Person is wearing a wristband and all future communication via Radio REFERRING TO A Young Person should use the wristband number for identification purposes and not the Young Persons name.
- Zone will include, pre-marked areas that are to be observed and kept too at all times, including: cutting area, chopping area, Zone toilet, designated adult/leader camp area, 8 No. 8m x 8m Patrol areas per Zone, 1 cubic meter of wood, 2x axe, 1x saw, 1x grenade/log splitter, Zone box with list of contents on outside, Zone radio (via Admin), Zone flag, up to 8 No. x Zone plain white flags and felt pens (for patrol flag competition) and 1x altar fire per Patrol.
- Zone staff are to ensure that the zone toilet is kept clean and supplied with toilet roll via Pink Fairies at all times please. Advise all Young People that the Toilet block next to ADMIN DEAN LODGE is for adults only and Young People are to use the far end toilet block for washing etc if required and the toilet on Zone.
- Your Zone will need a briefing for adults and Young People please, including info on safety, programme and your zone team, rules etc.
- On Saturday, all patrols to cook 3 hot meals across the day (breakfast/lunch/dinner) to be judged by Zone team, best team to be put forward for cooking competition on Sunday morning, (details of what is required to bring to competition by Patrol issued on day to Zone team).
- Campsite quiet at 11:00pm please.
- 7:00am campsite to wake up no noise before
- No FIRES Friday evening.
- All Young People and adults entering / using chopping area to have suitable footwear and NOT TRAINERS / SOFT TOE SHOES ETC when using the axe
- Communal area required on Zone for all Zone staff.
- Zone flag to be brought along to flag raise/break and all Young People to stand in Patrols and Zones please.
- Admin radio will be manned 24/7 during the event.
- Any Young People leaving early must be accompanied to admin by Zone staff including all personal kit.
- Cutting and chopping Zone to be staffed at all times when axes and saws available to Young People, locked and stowed away safely when not in use on Zone.

- Feedback form for each patrol in your zone will be available to fill in from when the event starts at 6:00pm on Friday until you are notified when admin will close the form on Sunday late morning / lunchtime. Forms can be saved and added to throughout the weekend without losing info. The form is more concise and does not repeat itself like last year!
- Event expected to finish at around 3:00pm 4:00pm latest on Sunday.
- All lost property to ADMIN please daily.
- The Far-end toilet block for Young People only, toilet block by ADMIN for ADULT STAFF only
- Zone staff will be called to meals via radio/admin. Please ensure a minimum of two leaders to be left on zone at all times.
- Emergency services access to be maintained at all times between Zones at all times.
- All zone rubbish to go into bins provided and emptied by Zone Staff / Young People on zone, to blue skip near the car park. Please sort through and recycle where appropriate.
- All wood to be returned to CPCW wood store at end of camp.
- Chopping and cutting zones to be dismantled and neatly stacked at end of camp.
- No generators on Zones
- Altar fires to be emptied and put into central area (2 no. maximum) after breakfast Sunday and the remainder stacked at the end of zone ready for the event fairies to collect.
- Scout POR will be applied at all times.
- Scoring via 'woggle-events' and wi-fi available to zone leaders to the woggleevents website only.
- Radio etiquette to be followed at all times (see separate sheet).
- All staff to check in/out of site over the whole weekend.
- Wristbands to be worn by all Young People and Staff at all times and any person not wearing a wristband is to be challenged.
- Zone and Event staff will be required to wear a hi-vis coloured Necker, with a number, assigned to each individual Staff member at all times. This is to identify all adults on site and to enable 'challenging' at any time of any adult on site without it.
- Please make sure that all of our Young People have fun and go home having the best possible experience that they can. This event can only grow from the experiences and skills obtained by the Young People on your Zone, the feedback they give to their scouting friends and coming back year after year to try and be their best against the rest. This all starts and finishes with you on Zone, so a positive experience is the best experience for us all.
