For the benefit of all the members of Legion Branch

During the past several weeks, I have been thinking much, of how the current very abnormal events, that are unfolding almost by the hour, have affected us all. Many of us represent the "vulnerable age categories," and I include myself. During these difficult times, it is easy to begin to worry, to become anxious, and allow the current normal to invade our thinking, and in many cases our actions.

I am reminded that while our current reality is difficult and fearful, that we can turn our eyes off ourselves and onto others. I am reminded that for many who are already isolated to some extent, being socially distanced from others, is incredibly taxing, and worrisome. And yet there may well be opportunity to look for a chance to bring daylight into the life of someone else. That would be different for all of us and would depend on how we look at life today.

I am choosing to focus on the good things happening around me and attempting to reach out to help someone else. Today for example, I had the opportunity to pick up a good supply of bread from one of our Sobey Stores and deliver it to a homeless shelter. It wasn't much, and yet I was able to get out, stay safe and make someone else's life just a little brighter. I use this opportunity simply as an illustration of what might be available. I would also encourage all of us to be reminded that the words of Jesus still ring true today. "I am with you, I will never leave you, nor will I forsake you." Then the words of Romans Chapter 8. (part of chapter)

What shall we say about such wonderful things as these? If God is for us, who can ever be against us? Since he did not spare even his own Son but gave him up for us all, won't he also give us everything else? ³³ Who dares accuse us whom God has chosen for his own? No one—for God himself has given us right standing with himself. Who then will condemn us? No one—for Christ Jesus died for us and was raised to life for us, and he is sitting in the place of honor at God's right hand, pleading for us.

Can anything ever separate us from Christ's love? Does it mean he no longer loves us if we have trouble or calamity, or are persecuted, or hungry, or destitute, or in danger, or threatened with death? No, despite all these things, overwhelming victory is ours through Christ, who loved us.

And I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, [p] neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow—not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love. No power in the sky above or in the earth below—indeed, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord.


