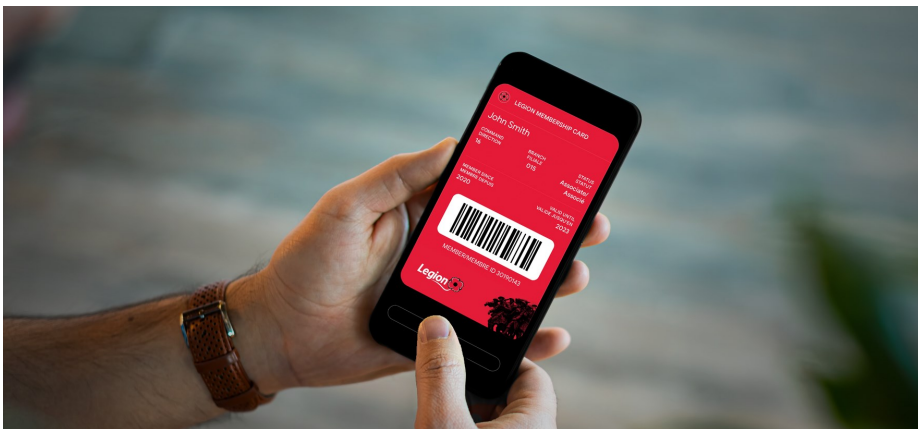

A Talk with the Padre

“Heaven and Easter”

A Meditation from your Padre, April 2023

Before I begin, I would like to apologize for not having an article prepared for our last Newsletter. I could offer several excuses but will provide only one. I got very much involved with a family whose 18 yr. son died unexpectedly and tragically. I officiated his service, and time ran out for me.

As I regularly do, I want to begin by saying how blessed I am to serve as your Padre, and to rub shoulders with men and women who have served and currently serve in our “Armed Forces.” As I listen to many of your stories, I am humbled by the sacrifice many of you have made, so I/we can enjoy the freedoms in our country, many around the world do not. I salute each of you.

Several weeks ago, I had occasion to be involved in a discussion around the table at the legion, and the topic of heaven came up. That got my mind thinking and this article is a brief response to some of the questions that were raised. For those who raised it, you know who you are, and I thank you.

“Sometimes our views of the afterlife make God an afterthought. We imagine reunions with loved ones, no disease, pain, sin, suffering and no tears, and all so true. But Heaven is Heaven because God is there.” Quote by Dr. Luke Stamps. So, let me mine that thought just a little.

The apostle Paul knew something about earthly suffering that he endured, and he wrote about a physical place that will be for eternity a “resting place,” for those who know Jesus as Saviour, a forever dwelling. “For we know,” Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 5:1,

“That if the earthly tent (our bodies) we live in are destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in Heaven, not built by human hands.”

HEAVEN IS A LITERAL PLACE, A FUTURE VISIBLE REALITY.

The Apostle John wrote in John 14:2,

My Father’s house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you?”

Heaven is better, more majestic, than anything we could even begin to imagine. It is more spectacular than anything that can be “constructed” here on earth. What Jesus is saying here is, if Heaven was not real and more glorious than you can even imagine, would I tell you that I am going there to prepare the place you will live in once you get there?

Not only is heaven a real place, but we are also keenly aware that earthly death is real, and it is next to taxes the only thing we can count on. Unless I am mistaken, we still have a 100% chance of facing death at some point. We know this, because anyone reading this article will have experienced the death of a loved one.

Each of us when, not if, we cross the “finish line,” of our lives and are faced with our eternal destiny no doubt desire that heaven will be our eternal home.

A Talk with the Padre

It is a place beyond our wildest expectations. A place without sorrow, death or crying, as the writer of the Book of Revelation informs us.

But, our entry into Heaven does NOT happen at the “Golden Gate,” with St. Peter asking us why we should be allowed entry, nor does it happen because our “good deeds, outweigh our bad.” Our guaranteed reservation for Heaven, is made by our decision to say “yes” to Jesus and accept His death on the Cross for our sins.

And this is where Easter comes in. Easter is more than just another Christian Holiday, or the Easter Bunny, or hiding easter eggs all over the yard. It begins with Good Friday, when we see Our Saviour Jesus Christ giving His life for us. He dies, and with His death our sins are forgiven. That is without question, we are saved by Grace and Jesus’ Grace alone. Ephesians 2:8-9 tells us:

**For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves,
it is the gift of God, not by works, so that no one can boast.**

God’s gift to us was His Son Jesus, and that happened “Good Friday.” And while we may think “Good Friday,” was anything but good, it is well to remember that the story did not end here, on a cross. Sunday came and Christ Rose by the power of our Creator God. The result is that today we serve a risen Christ, who is waiting for us to simply receive the Gift He has provided for us. When we do receive that Gift, then our reservation in Heaven has been secured. Following His discourse in His words of comfort to His followers, not long before He went to the Cross, the passage in John 14:1-6 ends with these words:

Jesus said, **“I am the way, the truth and the life,
no one comes to the Father except through me.”**

And that my friends, in the simplest of forms and words, is the invitation to experience forgiveness of our sins, and makes our reservation secure to spend eternity with Jesus in Heaven.

Think of these words I have used before found in John 3:16:

**“For God so loved the world, (and that word world means you and me) that He gave
His only Son, so that whoever should believe in Him will have eternal life.”**
And that eternal life is in Heaven.

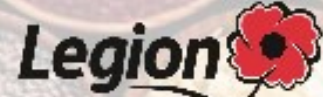
