"O Canada" was officially adopted as Canada's national anthem on June 27, 1980. The maple leaf was officially proclaimed the national arboreal emblem of Canada on April 25, 1996

Jeanne Sauvé was appointed the first female Governor General of Canada on Dec 23, 1983





Lincoln MacCauley Alexander PC CC OOnt CD QC was a Canadian lawyer who became the first black Member of Parliament in the House of Commons, the first black federal Cabinet Minister, the first black Chair of the Worker's Compensation Board, and the 24th Lieutenant Governor of Ontario from 1985 to 1991.



Terry Fox died of cancer at the midpoint of his cross-Canada Marathon of Hope on June 28, 1981

On Sept. 9, 1984 Pope John Paul II

Ten years after women were first admitted to military colleges in Canada, **Heather Erxleben** completed training at the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry Battle School in Wainwright, Alberta. In doing so, Erxleben became the first female combat soldier in Canada.





The Canadian CF-18 Hornet was introduced in the 1980s as a multirole replacement for the service's fleet of CF-101 Voodoos, CF-104 Starfighters and CF-116 Freedom Fighters.

A Talk With The Padre

"Why we believe what we believe?" (credit to RCMP Chaplain Tony Harwood-Jones for several quotes and statements. "used with permission")

Hyde Park, in England, has a worldwide reputation for freedom of speech. By official policy, anyone can stand up in its "Speakers' Corner," and say anything they like – short of promoting violence – and the most that the speaker will risk is being heckled. Over the years, people like Karl Marx, Vladimir Lenin, George Orwell, and many others have shown up in Hyde Park, and expressed their views quite freely. Indeed, there is case law in Britain that establishes that "...free speech includes not only the inoffensive but the irritating, the contentious, the eccentric, the heretical, the unwelcome and the provocative – provided it does not tend to provoke violence." (public domain)

Free speech is a lofty ideal, and one of the most admirable aspects of life in the "free world." But the eccentric and often radical statements made in Hyde Park got little traction, that is until recently.

With the invention of the Internet, and Social Media, the game has been changed dramatically, and not necessarily for the better. A person standing in a park and shouting, can be heard, at most, from about sixty metres away. Now the same thoughts and opinions can be typed into a social media post and be transmitted to an audience of millions within a few hours. (Tony Harwood-Jones)

On December 4, 2016, a young man named Edgar Welch drove from North Carolina to Washington, DC, with a loaded AR-15 rifle and some handguns in his car. He had read online that in the basement of the Comet Ping Pong restaurant, there was a child sexual abuse ring, tied to Hillary Clinton and the elites of the U.S. Democratic Party. He entered the restaurant, pointed his weapon at employees, and shot out the locks on a basement door. As he quickly discovered, there was no sign of the alleged atrocity. Police arrived, he surrendered immediately, and served four years in jail for his pains.

Mr. Welch is a dad. As he drove towards Washington, he recorded a video message for his two daughters, whom he had left asleep at their home: "I can't let you grow up in a world that's so corrupt by evil," he said, "without at least standing up for you and for other children just like you."

Clearly, Mr. Welch was motivated by something good: the desire to protect children from terrible evil. He seemed to sincerely believe that the evil was taking place in the basement of the restaurant. And, when he found out that there was nothing of the kind, he was fully cooperative with the police – coming out of the restaurant with his hands up, and voluntarily, lying face-down on the ground and allowing the police to apply handcuffs.

News of all this flew around the world, and there was considerable outrage: how could this apparently kindly man believe the false claim that he had seen on the Internet? And, if he did believe it, why did he not report it to the authorities, and ask to have it investigated, instead of taking vigilante action?

This second question – asking why he didn't contact authorities – is actually just as important as the question about why he should believe, and act upon, a false Internet allegation.

The world of false Internet claims is a world that does not trust conventional authority. If you were to ask Mr. Welch why he didn't seek to get the child abuse claim investigated, he may have replied that he didn't believe anyone in authority could be trusted to take action against the abusers.

A Talk With The Padre (Cont'd)

Given the opportunity I would pose the following for consideration. "If you don't trust public officials, how come you trust an unknown Internet blogger?" This of course brings us to the crux of the issue; how does one determine what is true or false. To whom and what can we turn to determine truth? Take for example the current reality of the Covid Pandemic. We have all heard the nay Sayers, who are getting their information from sources that may not be reliable, and yet they make critical decisions when it comes to even believing that this is real. Well actually we have all heard the word hoax when describing what the world is currently facing. And based on information not based on science decisions are made to disregard all Health Restrictions.

To contrast that stance, most of us believe based on good science, information from our Health Officials, and a myriad of statistics that Covid is real.

Let's just say this: any person or organization that has deliberately sickened at least 154,884,190 of the world's people, killing 3,238,586 of them, is worth fighting with all the tools we've got. If the pandemic is a deliberate plot, initiated by persons unknown, then public health measures designed to fight the disease are more necessary, not less. (Tony Harwood-Jones)

There are any number of sources for information, values, and priorities, other than the Internet. What is important? What is believable? And what is true? As you know I am a Christian, A follower of Jesus, and a minister. So please allow me to point each of us to a source of truth that we can take to the bank. Not many hours before Jesus was turned over to be crucified, His interrogator, Pilot the Governor at the time, asked the question, "what is truth?" So, the question of truth has been asked for millennia. Jesus answered the question this way, "you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." Jesus in John 14:1-6 said these words:

"Don't let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God, and trust also in me. There is more than enough room in my Father's home. If this were not so, would I have told you that I am going to prepare a place for you? When everything is ready, I will come and get you, so that you will always be with me where I am. And you know the way to where I am going."

"No, we don't know, Lord," Thomas said. "We have no idea where you are going, so how can we know the way?" Here is the truth we can literally base our lives on:

Jesus told him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me.

I believe The Bible is the revealed truth of God's Revelation, and presents the guidelines for living life today, in the midst of wherever life may throw at us.

It strikes me as being extremely risky for anyone to claim that there is nobody wiser or better informed than themselves. We are however wise when we place our trust in a God who loves us no matter what we have done, who we are or where we live. God has always been and will always be "The Highest Authority."

A Talk With The Padre (Cont'd)

The question really is, who do I go to when I want the truth? I can check out a host of sources, but in the end my counsel is that we do not put our trust and faith in half-truth, rumour, or the opinions of those who believe they are "smarter than anyone else." I check out the facts and then base my decisions on known truth, and that source for me is the Bible, the revealed revelation of God to His creation.

Jesus' harshest words were not for thieves, or sexual experimenters, they were for lies and liars. "Vipers!" he said, "you are like whitewashed tombs! Beautiful on the outside, but inside full of decomposing stink and death!" In another place, he said that the Devil is "the father of lies."

So, if someone shouts in a public park, or posts their opinion on the Internet, and chooses to falsely affirm that what they are saying comes from an authoritative source, the value of their message is vastly reduced. Hey, Hyde Park speaker! If you lied about who gave that message, what other parts of the message are lies!?? (Tony Harwood-Jones)

We live in a world that can cause even the boldest of us, to wake up with fear. I encourage us all to allow the peace that only God can give us to rule in our lives, our hearts and in our world. Jesus Himself said, "Fear not for I am with you, I will never leave you nor will I forsake you." Nothing, not Covid, not the economy going bankrupt, nor any physical issue we may face can separate us from God's Love.

"Romans 8:28-31, I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow—not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love. No power in the sky above or in the earth below—indeed, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord.
