News I am waiting MFRC is they are going to support the campaign if not Kingsway will try and take over the route. Last year they had a temporary person help them they don't have that this year, so Barb is talking to her boss and seeing what they are going to do.

Anvets will not be supporting the campaign this year, Trese phoned Norwood and notified them about that, so what they are doing is Pat will be giving us a route sheet and Trese will pass this onto Mike at Norwood.

Job shadowing with Brent Fitch is going well not sure if he wants the position or not but he is getting exposed to what goes on and we will go from there.

Quick notes we helped CFE Edmonton with their poppy campaign supplies. They took roughly 15,000 poppies, buckets and honor boxes. Lastly we had quite a few thefts of buckets, so I went around to quite a few of the business' Northgate and showed them a bucket with a chain on it, as
