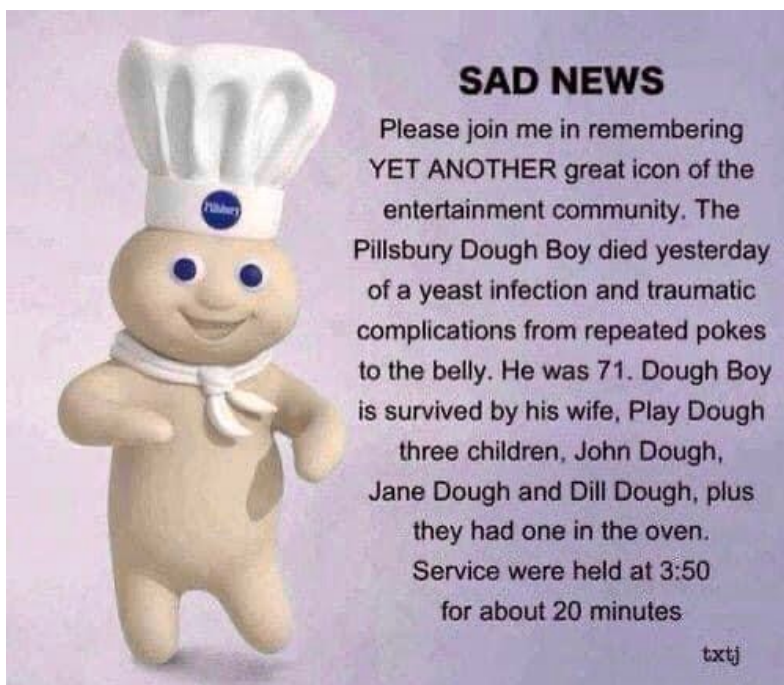

A Talk With The Padre

This message is an excerpt from a sermon I spoke at a Vegreville Church on Sunday September 07, 2021. I think it is applicable to most if not all of us whether we are connected to a church or not.

One sociologist concluded in the year 1900, the average person wanted 71 things of which they considered 18 of these essential. Today the average person wants 500 things and believes that 100 of these are essential. Interesting that the percentage of what we believe are essential is about the same, we just want more things.

It is this idea that if I had just a little bit more, I would be happier and more content. There always seems to be something on our “wish list,” that if I had it I’d feel better.

In the book of Proverbs, Chapter 1:17-19 Solomon, the wisest person ever to have lived makes this statement that is very worth considering:

If a bird sees a trap being set, it knows to stay away. And we would say of course, if we saw a trap we would stay away, but he goes on to say, that when it comes to wanting more, its like setting up an ambush that we walk into, and when we do it has the power to choke the very life out of us. We live in a culture that is anything but content with what we have. To be sure all discontentment is not wrong. I may be discontent with the way I see our culture or society conducting itself and so I decide to do something about that. This is a good thing. Or I may not be content with my relationships and decide to get some help to make them better. Also, a very good thing.

Contentment isn’t a place you arrive at in the future, it’s an attitude you embrace today. Author unknown.

The question we all must ask ourselves is, “**when is enough, enough?**” Researchers have studied this question for many years, using thousands of people as a sample group. The answer is always the same, “**just a little bit more.**” **John D Rockefeller** who in his day was one of the three wealthiest men in the world was asked, “**how much money is enough?**” and his response was, “**just a little bit more.**”

So why are we some of the most unhappy people in the world, and what is it that drives our discontentment? **One thing is, “discontentment is fueled by comparison.”** Social media is absolutely committed to making sure we become aware of what others have and we don’t. Ever buy something on Amazon or other online media, and once you place your order, you get this ad that comes up, “**others have bought this product that goes along with what you just bought, and we thought you might be interested in that.**” Well, I didn’t think I was, but now I wonder, should I be.? Didn’t think I needed that, but maybe I do.

The second piece is, “comparison is fueled by our insecurities.” We look at someone else and say to ourselves, I sure don’t have the stuff they do. Their family looks like they are enjoying the life so much more, and it must be because of..., and the list goes on.

Our discontentment is really an issue with our identity. We buy into the lie that who I am, and my value and worth are dictated by what I have, what kind of house I live in, and what my family is up to.

And that is where I want to land. Our value, our identify is not determined by what I own, or what I have done, or who I am. **Jesus spoke into this world of discontentment, Jesus always speaks to our greatest needs.** In Luke Chapter 12:15, He said this:

Then he said to them, “Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed. life does not consist in an abundance of possessions.”

What Jesus is saying that we are much more than what we have. We are important to the God who created us, and that life is much more than owning things.

Let me be clear, that owning things is not a bad thing, and owning a lot of things is not a bad thing, but where we miss the area of contentment in our personal lives is when the things we own are our “**main thing.**” When there is an obsession with wanting more, we fall prey to what I call “**destination addiction.**” Simply put many in our culture live as though the **next upgrade, or the next house, the next car or the next anything,** will bring contentment. That kind of belief system is both destructive and deceptive to our contentment quotient. The truth is we brought nothing into this world, and it is a sure thing we will take nothing with us when we make our transition from this life to the next.

My prayer for my own life and for yours, is that we will be content with what we have, remembering that my worth, my value as a human being is not conditioned on what I own, want to own, or consume. My worth is: **I am created in the image of God, and He does not make junk.**” I am loved by Him regardless of what I own, what I have done, or who I might be.

One of the reasons I enjoy being a member of the Legion, is that apart from the fact that we have elected officials for our executive, we all carry the rank of comrade. There is never mention of the rank any may have attained while serving in the military. Our value and worth as members of the legion is not determined by who I am, who I was, or what I own. It is determined by my commonality of purpose. As your Padre I have no more value or worth than anyone else, and so it is with us all. **That truth helps me understand just a little better, that in the eyes of God in whose image we are created, we all stand on equal ground.** I can be and need to be content with that.

Genesis 1:26-27 says this: **Then God said, “Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock and all the wild animals,^[a] and over all the creatures that move along the ground.” So, God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them.**

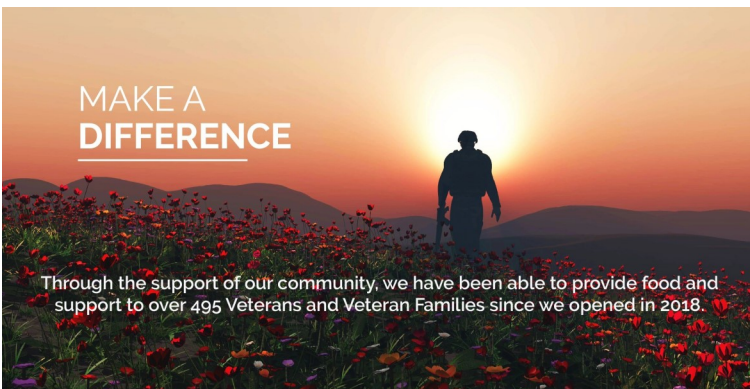
