## **Remembrance Day Ceremonies**



As I'm sure you are aware, this year's Remembrance Day Ceremonies will once again be quite different from previous years.

The Butterdome ceremonies have been cancelled and Kingsway Legion has been asked to host a smaller version at the Branch.

A ceremony will take place at the Kingsway Legion Cenotaph on November 11 and will follow the standard format as laid out in the Ritual, Awards & Protocol Manual. Our outdoor ceremony will have no capacity restrictions, but we encourage you to maintain 2 meters apart and to wear masks unless performing certain duties related to the ceremony.

The Branch will be open before and after the ceremony.

### Kingsway Legion has chosen to adapt the Restriction Exception Program. Proof of vaccination or medical exception will be required prior to entering the building including:

- Participants will be required to show proof of vaccination (2 doses);
- Participants may also show proof of a privately purchased negative PCR / Rapid Test within the last 72 hours. Tests from AHS or APL are not accepted);
- Medical exemptions are also acceptable;
- Social distancing of 2 meters is required;
- Masking is mandatory except while consuming food or drink or, if standing at a standing table, while consuming food or drink as long as the person remains at the standing table at all times; and
- Employees (i.e. bartenders) must mask at all times.

Once you have shown your proof you will be presented with a wristband that will allow you re-entry into the building without having to show proof again.


## **Kingsway Legion Ladies Auxiliary**

## **A Talk With The Padre**

### "Learnings from Kevin"

It goes without saying that we are never too old to learn. We learn often through difficult circumstances, some of our own making, others just come our way because we live life in a world that is not fair, is often judgmental and very quick to make decisions based on what we see, without knowing the whole story.

I have often been amazed that God, who is everywhere present would want a relationship with me, even after being critical of His creation. (Other people) Each of us live as it were in a different world, but all of us are Created in the Image of God. You will find that truth in the first book of the Bible, Genesis Chapter 1. The first twenty-five verses deal with God's creative handiwork, and then in Verse 26 and 27 we see where God said, "Let us create man (woman) in our own image, verse 27: So, God created human beings in His own image. In the image of God, He created them; male and female He created them.

All of us, each human being has equal status before God, and He values us beyond what we could even image. Each are unique, but each carry some of the **characteristics** that God carries. I am often humbled by that truth.

For the remainder of the space given to me, I would like to share this story, which was sent to me by Comrade AE Bince, who is a member of our Korean Vets Association. I use it with his permission although I believe it is "public domain."

### **Quote: "GOD LIVES UNDER THE BED"**

I envy Kevin. My brother, Kevin, thinks God lives under his bed. At least that's what I heard him say one night. He was praying out loud in his dark bedroom, and I stopped to listen, 'Are you there, God?' he said. 'Where are you? Oh, I see. Under the bed. I giggled softly and tiptoed off to my own room.

Kevin's unique perspectives are often a source of amusement. But that night something else lingered

long after the humor. I realized for the first time the very different world Kevin lives in. He was born 30 years ago, mentally disabled because of difficulties during labor. Apart from his size (he's 6-foot-2), there are few ways in which he is an adult.

He reasons and communicates with the capabilities of a 7-year-old, and he always will. He will probably always believe that God lives under his bed, that Santa Claus is the one who fills

the space under our tree every Christmas and those airplanes stay up in the sky because angels carry them.

I remember wondering if Kevin realizes he is different. Is he ever dissatisfied with his monotonous life?

Up before dawn each day, off to work at a workshop for the disabled, home to walk our cocker spaniel, return to eat his favorite macaroni-and-cheese for dinner, and later to bed.

The only variation in the entire scheme is laundry, when he hovers excitedly over the washing machine like a mother with her newborn child. He does not seem dissatisfied.

He lopes out to the bus every morning at 7:05, eager for a day of simple work.

He wrings his hands excitedly while the water boils on the stove before dinner, and he stays up late twice a week to gather our dirty laundry for his next day's laundry chores.

## **A Talk With The Padre**

And Saturdays - oh, the bliss of Saturdays! That's the day my dad takes Kevin to the airport to have a soft drink, watch the planes and, and speculate loudly on the destination of each passenger inside. 'That one's going' to Chi-car-go! 'Kevin shouts as he claps his hands. His anticipation is so great he can hardly sleep on Friday nights. And so goes his world of daily rituals and weekend field trips.

He doesn't know what it means to be discontent. His life is simple. He will never know the entanglements of wealth or power, and he does not care what brand of clothing he wears or what kind of food he eats. His needs have always been met, and he never worries that one day they may not be. His hands are diligent. Kevin is never so happy as when he is working. When he unloads the dishwasher or vacuums the carpet, his heart is completely in it.

He does not shrink from a job when it is begun, and he does not leave a job until it is finished. But when his tasks are done, Kevin knows how to relax. He is not obsessed with his work or the work of others. His heart is pure. He still believes everyone tells the truth, promises must be kept, and when you are wrong, you apologize instead of arguing.

Free from pride and unconcerned with appearances, Kevin is not afraid to cry when he is hurt, angry or sorry. He is always transparent, always sincere. And he trusts God.

His trust is not confined by intellectual reasoning, when he comes to Christ, he comes as a child. Kevin seems to know God - to really be friends with Him in a way that is difficult for an 'educated' person to grasp. God seems like his closest companion.

In my moments of doubt and frustrations with my Christianity, I envy the security Kevin has in his simple faith. It is then that I am most willing to admit that he has some divine knowledge that rises above my mortal questions.

It is then I realize that perhaps he is not the one with the handicap. I am. My obligations, my fear, my pride, my circumstances - they all become disabilities when I do not trust them to God's care.

Who knows if Kevin comprehends things I can never learn? After all, he has spent his whole life in that kind of innocence, praying after dark and soaking up the goodness and love of God. And one day, when the mysteries of heaven are opened, and we are all amazed at how close God really is to our hearts, I'll realize that God heard the simple prayers of a boy who believed that God lived under his bed. **But**, Kevin, well he won't be surprised at all!" **unquote**.

Somehow in his simple faith, Kevin understands that he is made in the image of God. My prayer for us all is that the truth of the Bible will be real to each of us. So, maybe it is not the Kevin's of this world who have disabilities, but rather us, who do not for whatever reason accept the simple message that God created us, and as His creation we are loved by Him unconditional and cared for beyond measure.
