Subject: Entertainment Update - May Events Recap & June Forecast

1. Recap of May - June Entertainment Events:

The month of May brought solid community engagement and a variety of entertainment offerings that continued to build momentum. Highlights included:

• Canteen Weekend Band Nights drew between 35 to 75 people per event, depending on weather, the featured act, and other city events. As per request to bring to the bands on only

performing one night for only \$400. That wasn't well received, so we will continue to brainstorm. I must mention that we are the one group that staying within our Year budget.

• Extreme Music Bingo and Comedy Nights remained steady with good member feedback.

Overall, entertainment remains **on budget** and continues to support community engagement and Food & Bar revenue.

2. Stanley Cup Playoff Oilers Watch Parties:

Throughout the playoffs, we hosted **Oilers Watch Parties** in all the rooms but mostly Juno Lounge, with **attendance ranging from 2 to 30 people**, depending on the game and time slot.

While I've heard some Executive comments stating that "we haven't made any money on this," I would respectfully counter with the following:

What has been the cost?

None to the Legion. These events are powered by my personal equipment, my time (unpaid), and my setup, including the large screen and sound system.

- We've offered Watch Party Menus (all monies go to the Legion) and we run 50/50 draws during the games with more than 10 people attending.
- These events have been advertised on our website, on social media, and posted at the door, ensuring members know we're open and active.
- Most importantly, these events **keep the doors open and the lights on** during Regular scheduled hours where we can't push people out of the legion for the staff to go home early. showing life in the building even with modest attendance.

The Watch Parties aren't about massive profits — they're about **consistency**, **morale**, **and member engagement**, particularly during one of the city's biggest sporting moments. And we did it **without spending a dime of Legion money**.

3. Neil Diamond Tribute – June 27, 2025:

Ticket sales are currently at as of today **169 out of 216**, putting us **over 75% sold** with 10 days to go.

Marketing efforts include:

- Continued radio coverage on 96.3 The Breeze
- Social media posts and event reminders
- Internal signage and vinyl street sign displays
- Member-to-member buzz and personal outreach

A final push is underway, and we are confident we can sell this out.

4. Concerns and Challenges:

While event performance has been solid, I must continue to raise concern regarding lack of support, linked to Executive and Staff challenges that have impacted planning, morale, and volunteer participation.

The Entertainment Program is **volunteer-driven**. If leadership cannot align and show consistent support, we risk losing the very people keeping this department running.

This needs to be addressed now. I strongly urge a meeting between Executive, Staff, and Entertainment Committee to rebuild trust, improve communication, and create a clear path forward.
