"PEACE BE ON YOU"

Good day Comrades. I trust as you read this article in this edition of our Branch Newsletter you are aware of how much you are appreciated, and how much your current and or past service continues to mean to us all. Also, if you noticed the title, you may be thinking, hey, is this a repeat from a recent article I wrote. While the title may be familiar, I can assure the contents are not. So, let me begin.

It was Sunday, April 19, 1964, at the RCMP Training Grounds in Rockcliffe, Ontario. I had been sworn into the RCMP as a 3rd.class Constable. (you cannot go any lower than that) a number of days before, and then spent several days on a Train, from Winnipeg to Ottawa. Early that morning we had been rudely awakened by the scratching recording of "Reveille," which you are all familiar with. We were all, (32 of us) standing at our version of attention in the Gymnasium, when out strode this 'god-like' creature with the shiniest high brown boots I had ever seen. Very quickly he informed us that he was going to be our drill instructor for the duration of our time in training which was to be nine months.

There we were 32 men/boys (some were only 19 at the time) wondering what we were doing here. Very quickly into this new and strange environment he began to tell us that probably none of us would pass training, we were the lowest form of human beings he had ever laid eyes on. Then he stopped in front of me, looked down at my shoes with very pointed toes, (which my fiancée had picked out for me and which were very much in fashion) he used words to describe me and my shoes, which I will not be using in this article. I then made an almost fatal error, I referred to this Cpl. As "sir" and you know what happened after that.

Later in the week, after six days of moving horse manure from one pile to another, watering and grooming horses, and polishing brass, running, and running some more, by weeks end I was afraid, I had been completely (as had others) verbally abused and exhausted by all the running, which I was not accustomed to. Sunday came around again, and we were allowed to leave the base to attend the church of our choice. As I got off the bus to walk the distance to the church I had selected on Bank Street, and there in the window was this plaque, with these words:

Isaish 26:3, King James Translation

Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee.

New Living Translation:

You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in you, all whose thoughts are fixed on you!

These few words made all the difference in the world for me and I repeated them over and over to myself over the next nine months, and have been my go-to for the past 61 years as I have walked the journey of my life.

"PEACE BE ON YOU" CONT'D

"Peace," is often used both as a greeting and a parting sentiment. But Jesus left us with these words: *My Peace I leave with you*. The emphases on the word "MY" makes the peace He is talking about, much more than just a mood or feeling, but an actual gift or possession that we can all experience each day. You see Jesus knew that His followers would need this level of Peace for what they were about to face, because of what He was about to face.

I know that what happened during my training as an RCMP Officer, was very common, and really no harm (I don't think) was meant by it. Life happens and what matters is how I react. Real peace, that inner peace cannot be dependent on everything going right. What matters if how I react to what is happening.

Jeus said, "Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." I personally like to focus on that last part: "Do not be afraid." Fear can be crippling, and there is much happening around us that can bring on fear. But it is comforting to know that His Peace if available for those moments in our lives. "Fear," many of you/us have experienced real fear, simply based on the careers we chose. But that fear is also present often, as we experience the loss of a loved one, we face a serious illness and much more.

His peace is more encompassing than just for serious seasons of life. He wants His us to claim His peace every day. Notice in the first part of the sentence He says, "do not let your hearts be troubled." That does not mean we will not have frustrations — they are just a part of life. But accepting Jesus' gift of peace means we will look to Him in both the big and small situations.

1 Peter 5:7, Give all your worries and cares to God, for he cares about you.

As we all walk the journeys of our lives, often fraught with worries, trials and joys, I invite you to remember, we can experience that inner peace despite our circumstances.

And so Comrades, I close with these words: May the Lord bless you and protect you. May the Lord make His face to shine on you. May the Lord be gracious to you. May the Lord look with favour on you, AND GIVE YOU, HIS PEACE
