



### "WHAT'S IN A NAME"

Before I begin my article, I wish to say I realize it has been a number of months since I have written and for that I apologize. While I could offer a lengthy explanation, please let me say that sometimes family involvements even at our age gets somewhat hectic, and choices needed to be made. That said here I am and I submit the following for your reading and meditation.

#### SO, WHAT IS IN A NAME?

First of all, and perhaps the most important to us personally is that our names identify us, within our family groups, within our communities and so on. Often, our names especially our first names, separate us from other members of our family.

Years ago, while still with the RCMP and working in an area where we had a large community of "Russian Doukhobors People," I found that in the majority of the population especially older folks, they only had one name. I worked for an N.C.O. who insisted that everybody must have a second name. So, seeing how Peter Verigin was the name of their founder, and in order to please our boss, we designated the initial P to all the males we interacted with, thus satisfying our boss. I know we have all worked for people like my then boss.

When we hear some names, we immediately identify that name with somebody, who in many cases is well known. When I mention:

"Mother Teresa," we think of a small Albanian Nun, who worked, and gave her life to the "least, the lost, and the Last," in Calcutta, India.

"Nelson Mandella," and I think of a courageous Black man from South Africa who spent 27 years in a South African Prison, "Robin Island" for being an activist, and then became the first Black President of South Africa, 1994 to 1990.

"Abraham Lincoln," the president of the U.S. during the Civil War, but largely known as the President who oversaw the abolishment of the evil Slave Trade.

"Romeo Dallaire," General, Force Commander of UNAMIR, the U.N. Peacekeeping Mission in Rwandan, during the genocide which he tried desperately to bring to the attention of the Political Masters, to no avail. He is the author of the Book, "Shake Hands with the Devil." Later became a Canadian Senator, and very vocal about the no stance the UN took in this genocide.

And truthfully this list could go on and on, but we get the point. Our names identify us as individuals, and in some cases with positions that we held or hold.

**So, I ask the Question, WHAT ABOUT THE NAME "JESUS?"** For some this name is said in anger, when we are frustrated, but His Name and what we do with His Name is really the most important decision we can make in our lives.

Six months ago, at Christmas we celebrated His birth, in a lowly stable. Then this past Easter, we commemorated His Death on the Cross, where He gave up His life, so we could be forgiven. So, the question begs to be asked what about His Name. It was a name that was given to Him by His Mother Mary, at the command of the Angel that visited her. His was the Name above all Names, and yet He lived His life in simplicity and humility.

### "WHAT'S IN A NAME" CONT'D

### From the Book "Magnificent Jesus," I recently read, and I share it with you

"He was born in an obscure village, the child of a peasant woman. He grew up in still another village, where he worked in a carpenter shop until he was thirty.

Then for three years he was an itinerant preacher. He never wrote a book. He never held an office. He never had a family or owned a house. He didn't go to college. He never traveled more than 200 miles from the place where he was born.

He did none of these things one usually associates with greatness. He had no credentials but himself. He was only 33 when public opinion turned against him. His friends ran away. He was turned over to his enemies and went through the mockery of a trial. He was nailed to a cross between two thieves. When he was dying, his executioners gambled for his clothing, the only property he had on earth. As He was dying, He prayed this prayer to His Father God, "Father, forgive them for they know not what they are doing." After he died, he was laid in a borrowed grave through the pity of a friend, from which He rose on the Third Day.

Twenty centuries have come and gone, and today he is the central figure of the human race, the leader of mankind's progress. All the armies that ever marched, all the navies that ever sailed, all the parliaments that ever sat, all the kings that ever reigned, put together, have not affected the life of man on earth as much as that One Solitary Life. His Name is Jesus, and He is: **Unmatched**, **Unrivaled**, **Unparalleled**" "Tony Cooke").

On Name, Jesus a Name above everything else, but not just a name, He came to redeem us, and invites us into a relationship with Himself. John 3:16, "for God so loved the world, that He gave His only son, (JESUS) that whoever puts their believe in Him, will not perish, but have eternal




