

#### "WOW, I CAN'T BELIEVE IT"

Dedicated to those who served and those who still serve. To the men and women who played a role in securing the freedoms we enjoy, and all to often take for granted. I salute each one of you, and pray that you are keeping well.

On Thursday, October 16, 2025, my wife Ann and I had the privilege of being part of a Canadian Citizenship Ceremony in Calgary. A number of years ago we met a young woman, and we will simply refer to her as "D." D immigrated to Canada with other members of her family when she was still in her teens. D is now well into her adult life and for the past 6000 plus days she has waited to become a Canadian Citizen, but because of some irregularities with other family members there have been delay after delay. Finally following much stress and not just a little money for legal help, her dream came true this past Thursday. The ceremony which included 127 other candidates was presided over by a recipient of the "Order of Canada." It was humbling to be part of this ceremony, as the oath of loyalty to Canada was given and repeated in both French and English by the recipients who represented the various parts of Canada. Following this ceremony Ann and I had the privilege of having lunch with D, and continued our celebration with her. I experienced a sense of pride for our country during the ceremony that I have not felt in a long while.

But you know what really set this special event apart was D's regular exclamations, "Wow I can't believe it. It finally happened after all these years, I am a Canadian now, I can vote, I can run for office, and the world just opened for me.

As I reflected on this experience, I was impacted by the correlation between the between two events we celebrate each year, 'Canadian Thanksgiving,' and 'Remembrance Day." Both days are set aside to express gratitude for our Great Country, and the Freedoms and abundance we enjoy. And, coupled with this, we remember the sacrifice by men and women to ensure we continue to experience a country we can live in freely, and enjoy the abundance we enjoy.

What was D so grateful for? Well, there were actually many, freedom to vote for whomever you wish. Freedom to move across this country. A great Health Care System, that while not perfect, stands head and shoulders above anything she experienced in her country of origin. Freedom to say what you want to say, even if it is against the Government without fearing retribution, and the list went on. "Wow, I can't believe it." To see the joy, the twinkle and sparkle in her eyes, and while D did not wrap herself in a Canadian Flag, which by the way I suggested might be a good move, she was proud to tell others, "I am a Canadian."

Comrades, while I acknowledge there was much euphoria here in this experience, and that will wear off to some degree, I have to ask myself. How grateful am I to be living in this great country, where I can enjoy and benefit from my freedom? Some of us tend to be more pessimistic than others, and I would include myself in this category. Following this experience with D, I have determined to express my gratitude for where I live, and the many freedoms we enjoy.

Gratitude seems to be something that we see less and less of as the days of our lives go on. An in-depth study by University of Massachusetts Dartmouth, discovered that gratitude has huge benefits to our daily lives. 
