RESULTS OF THE SPECIAL MEETING HELD JULY 29.2025

On July 29 the Branch held a special meeting to vote on a motion regarding how the Branch should move forward given it's current financial position.

The motion read that Kingsway Legion Branch authorize the President and his committee, the authority to pursue:

Continuing as is: maintaining current operations at the existing facility. This approach, however, faces ongoing financial deficits unless significant new revenue sources or cost reductions are achieved.

Sell the building: disposing of the current property and relocating to a smaller, more manageable, and financially viable site aligned with current operational needs.

Lease all or part of the west wing and/or the kitchen: renovating a section of the property for lease, which could generate additional income to offset expenses.

After an one hour of Question & Answers the motion was tabled until the end of September.

Thirteen members of the Branch stepped forward and will be broken into three groups focusing on one the three recommended options. Their role will be to provide more information including the financial implication to the Branch as while as other pertinent information they feel the Branch members should be aware of to make a clear decision.



"PEACE KEEPING. PEACE MAKING"

As we look around us, and around our world, it is hard to imagine that while the heart's desire of most people would be to live in peace, it is difficult to even imagine living in such a world. As I begin my article today I want to say thank you to each and every one of our comrades who have served in anyone of the arms of the Canadian Military, or are serving today, to our Police Officers, to any and all of our First Responders for the efforts you make each day, or have made in the past, so we can experience a sense of peace and tranquility in our communities and in our Country.

As I enjoyed Canada Day, with some family, I felt a sense of gratitude the country in which we live. Oh to be sure, we are not perfect, some, okay probably all of our leaders are not perfect, we have so much to be grateful for. And dare I say that "Peace" is one of the attractions that many new Canadians are grateful for. I cannot even imagine what it must be like to live in a Country, where I can't even take a leisurely walk outside without fear. May we ever be grateful for our forefathers as they ventured into a New World, with courage and a steadfastness that deserves my respect and honour.

As I reflected on the word peace and what it means to us, I thought back many years to 1954 when Canada became involved in "Peace Keeping Missions." Many of you reading this article will have your memories jogged when you reflect on the Peace Keeping Missions you have been personally involved with. I had limited interest in our Troops being involved in "Peace Keeping Missions," until our son Darin, (who served 32 years in Military) served in a Peace Keeping role, In 1 RCR on Cyprus, for a six-month deployment. I guess the saying is true that when you have some "skin the game" you develop a "real" interest in these kinds of Missions. Since then, I have followed with great interest his, and others deployments on UN Missions around the world. Since 1954 our men and women, and that includes many of you have served in any number of places around the world in "Peace Keeping" roles. The Balkans, Cambodia, the Congo, Cyprus, East Timor, Egypt, Ethiopia, Eritrea, Haiti, Rwanda, Somalia, and Syria, and others places. All to say that our Canadian Troops have served the world wide "Peace Keeping" initiatives with courage, Distinction and valor, in places where most of us would not venture.

And while we continue to work at "Keeping the Peace" much of that changed when our troops were committed to a "**Peace Making Operation**" in Afghanistan, from 2001 to 2014. For those who served during this Operation, thank you from the bottom of my heart. I am very aware of the waiting for news from loved ones who served here, including my son, who was deployed here a number of times, this time as a member of JTF2.

That brings me to the "main theme" of this writing. I will be quick to add here that I am in no way suggesting I am an expert in the area of "Peace Keeping, or Peace-Making Missions." I have been involved in both those roles as 24-year member of the RCMP stationed in various locations. I learned very early in my career as a young officer, attending a domestic complaint by myself. (RCMP members often work alone) it was evident within the home that there had been a serious battle going on, with both spouses showing bruises and the like. I had no clue what to do.

So, with my limited experience, I decided that taking the wife's side, and attempting to arrest her husband was the best course of action. literally within seconds she turned on me, and now I had both people against me. With no back up available I retreated and left the two to figure it out, until the next call.

So, Peace Keeping or Peace Making? What was my job in this case? I know now, but then? I did learn that sometimes we do both. I also learned never to take sides in these kinds of disputes.

"PEACE KEEPING, PEACE MAKING" CONT'D

Definition of Peace Keeping

Active work to stop or prevent conflict between nations or communities, especially by an international military force:"

That brings me to the "main theme" of this writing. I will be quick to add here that I am in no way suggesting I am an expert in the area of "Peace Keeping, or Peace-Making Missions." Definition of Peace Making

The process of bringing about peace, especially by reconciling adversaries: "a serious attempt to engage in peacemaking after years of violence"

It would seem that, that in our personal lives, whether in our families, our work places, or places we volunteer in, like our Legion we are often called on to become "Peace Makers," by the definition noted above.

A week ago, (I am writing this on Canada Day) I spent the week considering the "Upside Down Teaching of Jesus," on the Beatitudes found in the book of Matthew, Chapter 5:3-10. As I was thinking about this it dawned on me how little peace there really is around us. We seem to live in a world that anything but peaceful. That unfortunately extends to our families in many cases, to our work environment, and into our other personal relationships.

Consider the definition of "Peace" in it simplest form:

freedom from disturbance; tranquillity: as in "he just wanted to drink a few beers in peace"

We do not have to look far before we see areas of life, maybe our lives which would be well served if we were striving to be "peacemakers."

Matt. 5:9, "God Blesses those who work for peace, for they will be called the children of God."

We see that "Peacemaking," requires action on our part, if our relationships with one another are to be solid, and free of disturbance. Peacemakers lead with empathy and in a posture of humility. Peacemakers listen respectfully even when they do not agree with someone, and work hard to understand, and "Peacemakers lead the way with truthfulness and a gracious spirit.

I admit this is a very cursory look at "Peacemaking," but I think we get the picture. While "Peacekeeping" is an important aspect of our lives, what really matters is "Making the Peace," which I believe is a quote from Retired General Romeo Delaire.

My Prayer for us all: Gracious Father, we want to take the time to say thank You for the Peace we enjoy within our country of Canada, and the unwarranted gift of calling Canada Home. I thank You that You sent Jesus into our world, who was the ultimate PEACE MAKER. Jeus came to reconcile us to a Holy God. And, only Jesus could do that. Reconciliation was needed because of our sinful lives. Thank You Jesus for being a Peace Maker, and calling us to do the same. Teach us to live with grateful hearts, to be generous with what You have blessed us with. May we be "Peacemakers," to those who live on the fringes of society, to those who we live with, work with, play with.

I pray this in the Name of Jesus who came into this world as: "The Prince of Peace."
