"OVERWHELMED YET VICTORIOUS"

Maybe and quite likely it's a redundant question, but I will ask it anyway. Are there ever times when you have felt overwhelmed by circumstances that come your way? Maybe it's a health issue, maybe it's having to look at downsizing where we live, or maybe our finances are not quite where we would have thought they would be at this stage of our lives. Maybe it's a sense of where to from here as we look to the future for our Legion. Or maybe it is a relational issue, that has us overwhelmed. Truth be told I am all but certain that many of us have or are facing circumstances and maybe through no fault of our own, that overwhelm us. If that is the case for you then let me be quick to add that "you are not alone."

With that in mind I would like to share a story with you, that many are no doubt very familiar with. The story involves a young man, who is best known to most of us for two major projects, and while there was much more to him then these two events, we will stick with just these two. The first is the writing of what we call "The Shepherds Psalm," Ps. 23 and it goes like this:

The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing. He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he refreshes my soul. He guides me along the right paths for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me, your rod and your staff, they comfort me You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely your goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

David the writer of this poem, wrote it during a time when he was overwhelmed with the circumstances of his life. He was relegated to looking after his dad's sheep, and would no doubt have spent weeks if not months by himself, with little companionship, except his sheep.

But David's real claim to fame is his killing of the giant Goliath, and we find that story in 1 Samuel 17. David's rise to fame takes place in the Valley of Elah, where he meets a Bronze Age Version of Bobby Jackson. Goliath stands 9 ft. 9 inches tall, he wears 126 lbs of armour, and each day he comes out defies the armies of Israel to come and fight him. The Philistines are might warriors, and their champion Goliath boasts: **This day I defy the armies of Israel! "Give me a man and let fight each other." 1 Sam. 17:10.** On eighty separate occasions over 40 days, the Israel Army hears his voice, turned tail and ran. It was an utter beatdown. The Philistines were the middle school bullies, and the Hebrew soldiers were pale-faced first graders. Goliath emasculated them, intimidated them, demoralized them. To say they were completely overwhelmed would indeed be an understatement.

BUT THEN, David shows up, sent by his father to bring some food for his three brothers who were part of this army, of a shivering litter of "wet puppies." They are demoralized and overwhelmed.

David was the youngest in his family — a teenager. Too young to go to battle. Too young to join the army. At least that is what others thought. **BUT! Not David.** The ruddy-skinned and skinny son of Jesse showed up and piped up:

What will be done for the man who kills this Philistine and removes this disgrace from Israel? Who is this uncircumcised Philistine that he should defy the armies of the living God? 1 Samuel 17:26

"OVERWHELMED YET VICTORIOUS" CONTID

The Bible records thousands of David's words. We know more about David than about any other person in holy Scripture. Sixty-six chapters are dedicated to his story, more square inches than any biography other than 'Jesus'. The New Testament mentions his name fifty-nine times! And, of all his recorded words, these are the first. And, of all the words, these are arguably the best.

He calls Goliath an "uncircumcised Philistine." Or in modern parlance, a filthy, rotten scoundrel. Politically, correct? No. Spiritually sensitive? No doubt. He marched into the battle keenly aware of the "armies of the living God." He sees a battle; he thinks of God. While the entire army is overwhelmed by their circumstances, David thinks of God who is the only one who can deliver.

And you? How does David's reaction to the enemy compare with yours and mine?

Too Often in my "being overwhelmed" I allow the situation to become my Giant, and then I am reminded that "God is in this situation." If you take the time to read this story, you will find that David mentions God a lot, and he has placed his complete trust in Him.

Every time he opens his mouth, he mentions God.

He told the army: who is this uncircumcised Philistine that he should defy the armies of the living God?

1 Sam. 17:26

He told the King: The Lord who rescued me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will rescue me from the hand of this Philistine. 1 Sam. 17:37

He told Goliath: You come to me with a sword, a spear, and a shield, but I come to you in the name of the Lord of Hosts, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have reviled. This day, the Lord will deliver you into my hand. And I will strike you down and cut off your head. Then I will give the corpses of the Philistine camp to the birds of the air and to the beasts of the earth so that all the earth may know that there is a God in Israel. And then all this assembly will know that it is not by sword and spear that the Lord saves. For the battle belongs to the Lord, and He will give you into our hands. — 1 Samuel 17:45–47

And then he goes to war, with nothing but his sling and five smooth stones, one of which he puts into his sling. No one places any bets on David, not his brothers, not Saul the King, no one gives him a fighting chance. Everyone is overwhelmed with the odds being in Goliath's favour, except God & David.

David loads a stone; Goliath raises his sword. The shepherd Boy swung, while the giant smirked. The Rock flew and the skull cracked, and the battle was over before it began. Goliath collapsed, and the armies of Israel are suddenly infused with courage, no longer overwhelmed with the odds against them, but now the odds are in their favour, and a new day begun for them, and its all God's doing.

As God was with the armies of Israel, he wants to be with us in our times where we feel overwhelmed, and with that in mind I leave you with these words of Jeus Himself: Matthew 11:28-30, "come to me all who are weary (overwhelmed) and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light." (my word)
