



A TALK WITH THE PADRE

As I begin my monthly writing for our Newsletter, I am reminded that we will be receiving this N.L. just in time for Easter, 2022. As I reflect on that time of year, I am reminded that within Christendom we take significant time in each calendar year to stop and observe, commemorate and or celebrate two major events, which while separated by give or take four months are inseparable.

Christmas is a time of Joy, New Birth, Celebration, Gift giving and receiving, and the list goes on. Yet there is a side to Christmas which we may overlook and while that may be valid, it is however directly connected to Easter. So, you may ask really, how are those two events connected and inseparable? Well, I'm glad you asked.

I begin by recording what was probably the first Bible Verse I ever learned as a kid. I was eight years old and preparing for summer camp, (I think my mom needed a break) and I know that was a verse I needed to commit to memory. I may have already known it, but I do know I had it memorized for camp. It may be a verse that you are familiar with. We see the numbers regularly at Sporting Events, on Tee Shirts. They are really the numbers of truth; they are the numbers of hope.

John 3:16, "For God so loved the world, that He gave us His only son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal/everlasting life."

The truth of that verse is that God loved us, we are part of the world, so much that on Christmas the Christ Child was born to a human woman. Imagine for a moment, that God Himself in the form of a human baby, confined to a woman's womb for nine months, came into this world for one single purpose. We call that Christmas, and we celebrate His coming. For thirty-three years He lived, being God in His deity, power and all knowing and yet living as a human being. Why? So he could identity with the human race.

But then, the tide of public opinion turned against Him, and the purpose of His coming in the first place began to unfold. And that brings us to Easter. God loved the world that He had created so much, and His desire to be in relationship with us was so important to Him, that His only Son, gave up His life willingly so we could be in a relationship with Him.

I recently completed reading a Book by Max Lucado, entitled 3:16. While there are numerous illustrations that stood out, I want to share one with you which for me was the highlight. In John 3:16, God does for us what Bill Tucker's father did for him. Bill was sixteen when his dad suffered a health crisis which forced him to leave his business. After regaining his health, the Tucker family struggled financially barely getting by. Mr. Tucker came up with an idea. He won the bid to reupholster the chairs at the local movie theater. The family was stunned, he had never stitched a seat. He didn't own a sewing apparatus. Yet, he found someone to teach him the skill he needed, and he located an industrial-strength machine. The family scraped together every penny they had to buy it. They drained every account they had, and even dug coins out of the sofa. Finally, they had enough.

It was a great day when Bill rode with his dad to pick up the machine. Bill recalls the hours long trip discussing the bright horizons this new opportunity would afford them. They loaded the machine in the back of the truck and secured it. Dad, then invited his son to drive home. Bill continues the story.

"As we were driving along, we were excited and I, like any sixteen-year-old driver was not paying enough attention to my speed. I was turning on the cloverleaf to get onto the freeway,

I will never ever, ever forget watching the sewing machine, which already top-heavy begin to tip. I applied the brakes, but it was too late. I saw it go over the side. I jumped out and ran around the back of the truck, and as I rounded the corner, I saw our hope and dream lying on its side in pieces. And then I saw my dad just looking. All his risk, all his endeavor, all his struggling, all his dreams, and all his hope to take care of his family was lying there, shattered.

"You know what comes next, don't you? 'Stupid, punk kid driving too fast, not paying attention, ruined the family by taking away our livelihood.' But that's not what he said. He looked right at me. "Oh, Bill, I am so sorry." He walked over, put his arms around, and said, "Son, this is going to be okay."

God is whispering the same to each of us. Those are arms we can feel. That is a voice we can hear. When life, as it often appears to fall to pieces, seem irreparable, and hopeless, its going to be okay. You ask Bob, how can you make a statement like that? I know, because "God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son."

If God can make a billion galaxies, why would I not believe that He can came something good out of our bad, and sense out of our sometimes-faltering life? He can and He will, because He loved the world, and you and I are part of His world.

And that comrades, is the real story of Easter. It is the story of a God loving us so much and desiring to have a personal relationship with each of us, that prompted Him to provide us with Jesus, who came so we could live.

So, this Easter as we gather with family and friends, as we hide Easter Eggs, chocolate rabbits, for our kids, or more likely our grandkids, lets enjoy the time together. Let's enjoy and cherish the memories we are building, but most of all let's stop! Stop to remember what Easter, is all about, and how Jesus coming to earth and dying on a cross, so I/we could have a relationship with Him, and by accepting His death on my behalf, spending eternity with Him.

For God loved the world in this way: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life. John 3:16, CSB

May each of you feel blessed and encouraged this Easter Season. Blessings on you all.

VETERAN SUPPORT

Legion Supports the Awarding of Private Larochelle

The Royal Canadian Legion is supporting efforts to award a Canadian soldier the <u>Canadian Victoria Cross</u>. It is the country's highest honour for bravery, valour, self-sacrifice and devotion to duty when in the presence of an enemy.

Private Jess Larochelle served in Afghanistan and performed selfless acts to save others during an attack by enemy forces in 2006. Media reports describe a badly wounded and bleeding soldier who returned to his post to prevent further casualties as enemy fighters gained ground. While severely injured he fired multiple M72 rockets, resulting in the enemy's retreat and saving the rest of his section. Two members had already died.


"There is no doubt that Private Larochelle went above and beyond in excruciating circumstances to save his Comrades and serve our nation," says Bruce Julian, Dominion President. "We ask that our military leaders review Private Larochelle's actions with a view to honouring him with this award."

The Legion joins a chorus of others requesting Pte. Larochelle be recognized for his extraordinary service with the Canadian Victoria Cross.

He was previously awarded the Star of Military Valour, which is the second highest award for bravery.

The <u>Victoria Cross</u> was established in 1856 and has been awarded to over 80 Canadians. The Canadian Victoria Cross was established on 1 January 1993 and has not been awarded to any soldiers to date
