# On Tuesday Nov 24 the Alberta government announced the following changes that effect your Legion:

- No Indoor Social Gatherings in any setting
- Maximum of six people from the same immediate household at a table and no movement between tables.
- People who live alone can meet with up to two non-household contacts as long as they're the same two throughout the duration of these restrictions
- Only seated eating and drinking is permitted. No other services or entertainment will be allowed, including billiards, games or darts.
- Liquor can be sold until 10 pm and food-serving establishments must close to in person-dining at 11 pm.
- No festivals or events
- Mandatory masks for indoor workplaces

As I watched the Remembrance Day ceremony in Ottawa. A WW2 veteran was asked about his memories of the war and he simply said "We had a job to do and we did it." For me that sums up the 2020 Poppy campaign for Kingsway Legion, in order for us to honour our veterans, we had a job to do and we did it. Due to the pandemic, we had to cancel Tag and the Ladies Auxiliary days. Some businesses chose not to participate, but many others welcomed us with open arms. On several occasions I was thanked by someone for carrying on the tradition of making poppies available to the public.

Due to our <u>Wonderful Volunteers</u> we were able to provide over 300 Business with poppy kits to promote the campaign. Many of our volunteers also donated their time representing our branch by sitting at a table in Northgate mall or Londonderry Mall accepting donations. It truly is impressive watching the public react with a veteran who is sitting at a table wearing their medals. We also provided 70 schools with poppy kits and information on how they can learn more about Remembrance Day. Its critical that young people learn about the sacrifices made by our veterans and why we celebrate Remembrance Day.

One of my favorite memories during the campaign was watching five young High School students stop by the Northgate Mall table to pay their respects to the veteran who was sitting there and make a donation.

Each and every volunteer hour is greatly appreciated, the work parties to put kits together, packaging poppies for distribution, stepping in last minute when called upon. As well as all the other tasks that made the 2020 Poppy Campaign a success in these trying times.

Our first year of having a Poppy Office in the Kingsway branch was very successful. We received in excess of 100 calls, we estimate 20,000 Poppies were requested this way. The Poppy office also processed donations received through mail, phone and in person.

After seven years of being the Poppy Chairman at Kingsway Legion Bill O'Brien has decided this will be his last campaign at the helm. His contribution to the Poppy campaign has helped many veterans and I would like to personally thank him for his dedication. He has been a wonderful mentor to me and I will miss his guidance going forward.

# CAF Veteran Participants Needed for Chronic Pain Study

#### Criteria:

- Male CAF Veteran
- Chronic pain lasting longer than 3 months
- · Served primarily in the Army
- Have been deployed internationally

#### Participation:

- 1-1.5 hour confidential video/phone interview about factors affecting your pain
- \$20 Visa gift card provided after consent as thank you for time
- Contribute to understanding of chronic pain in CAF veterans

Are you a Canadian Armed Forces Veteran living with chronic pain? You can be part of a research study that examines the different variables associated with chronic pain to better understand how it develops and is maintained.

This study focuses on a specific sub-group not yet been examined in the existing research. Studies of other sub-groups within the Veteran population are planned for a later date.
