Potential Tax Victory on 2020 Bill

On June 1st our Branch was able to secure a victory in the second step of our talks with the City to have our taxes reduced. Item # 6.3 Kingsway Legion Outstanding Tax Balance Options was first item on the agenda of the City Council Executive Committee Meeting. Present at the meeting were Comrades Rick Etmanski, Ron Wills, and Carol Wills.

After an hour of debate, Item 6.3 was moved by: J. Rice Carried: 5-0-0 **That Executive Committee recommend to City Council: That Administration cancel previously levied municipal property taxes from the 2020 Selection Sheet | June 1 2022, Executive Committee of taxation year in the amount of \$35,253 on account 10189875 as well as associated penalties with the amount to be paid for through the tax loss reserve.**

If approved, this motion would work out more favorably for the Branch. We went in there looking to have the arrears penalties removed and left with a very good chance to receive a \$35,253 refund (enough to pay our 2022 taxes).

Prior to moving to Ontario, Comrade Steve Kuervers started the ball rolling over two years ago. In the absents of Comrade Kuervers, Comrade Ron Wills stepped up to keep pressure on the city.

The final step could happen as early as next week when the full council votes on the motion. All indication are that the motion will be past.

We will keep you apprised of the final outcome.

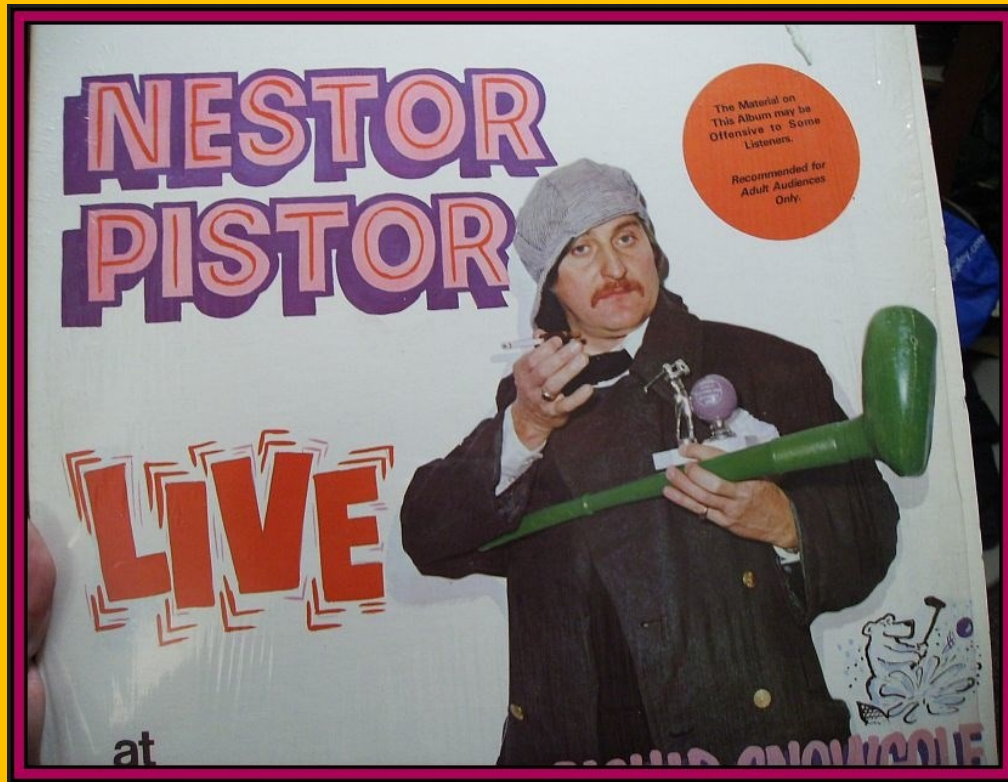

FROM YOUR PADRE'S PEN

Before I get into the meat of my writing this month, let me say how much I appreciate being able to provide some words of encouragement but perhaps also some food for thought. I want to thank those who have taken the time to respond to some of my talks, that way I know they are being read.

In addition, I will not be doing a message for July as Ann and myself will be away first to Southern Manitoba where I will be speaking at the Memorial Service for my very good friend who passed away last fall, and whose service very few could attend because of Covid. Following that Ann and I will be flying to Ottawa and then off on a Cruise where I will be officiating my son's wedding. (Son who spent 32 years in Military) All that to say, I will pick up again come late July or August.

When I attended High School, I enjoyed literature and history. I had little difficulty memorizing poetry, and won the Southern Manitoba spoken poetry championships. One of the poems I memorized is entitled "Invictus." It is a powerful presentation of the strength of an individual or at least can be. This poem also surfaced a week or so ago, as I was preparing to officiate at a Funeral Service. Re-united with this poem, prompted my writing for this time around. So, let me share the poem with you and then I would like to challenge the poem, based on what the Bible has to say.

Invictus

**Out of the night that covers me,
Black as the Pit from pole to pole,
I thank whatever gods may be
For my unconquerable soul.
In the fell clutch of circumstance
I have not winced nor cried aloud.
Under the bludgeoning's of chance
My head is bloody, but unbowed.**

**Beyond this place of wrath and tears
Looms but the Horror of the shade,
And yet the menace of the years
Finds and shall find me unafraid.**

**It matters not how strait the gate,
How charged with punishments the scroll,
I am the master of my fate:
I am the captain of my soul.**

We are people who love to be in control, and yet as we walk the journey of our lives we realize that we really do not have control of a whole lot. We certainly are not able to control the circumstances that we find ourselves in most of the time. Not long ago I officiated a funeral service and made note that about the only people who have absolute control are newborns.

A TALK WITH THE PADRE

Think about it, when a baby is in the room and start to cry, scream or maybe only fuss, life stops, and all eyes are on the child and the parent to do something. I don't know if the baby knows they are in control, but they seem to be.

Each of us are faced with situations and circumstance that puts us in a state of fear, anxiety and sometimes even incapacity to function well. We are fearful and many of us have been in situations that we should have been fearful in. We fear getting older, and not being to look after ourselves. We fear loss of basic function and maybe even a fear of, "are my finances going to serve me to the end of life?" The truth of the matter is we are meant for something much bigger than any of us are or can become on our own.

Here is where I challenge and push back on the last couple lines. **I am not the master of my fate; I am not the captain of my soul.** We are created beings, made in the very image of God.

Genesis 1:26-27:

Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock and all the wild animals and over all the creatures that move along the ground."

So, God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them.

God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number.

In another place we are asked the question: **Can the created (that's you and me) say to the Creator, why did you make me like this?"** The answer of course is 'NO WE CANNOT NOT.' So, we the created ones, are so dependent on the One who created us. As a Christ Follower, I find it impossible to rely on my abilities alone to walk the path of life we are called to walk. **"God is supreme, God is God our Creator, and I am not."** While that is a humbling thought it is comforting at the same time. I do not have to walk alone, especially during these difficult days of uncertainty.

As we as veterans of various stripes and length of service, of those who are our comrades within our great organization, The Royal Canadian Legion, face the future, it is my prayer for us all that we will not attempt to captain our own lives, but rely on our Creator God to provide a sense of peace, a sense of tranquility, and direction.

I conclude with a passage I have used in the past, and a passage many of us have learned way back when we were kids. I know I did, and trusted this Jesus who said in John 3:16:

For God so loved the world, that He gave His only son, that whoever believes in Him, should not perish, but have eternal life.

My Prayer for you all is that you will enjoy a great summer, maybe traveling for the first time in several years, or just hanging out in the sun. May you experience a joyful and rewarding season of life.

The goal of the Coding for Veterans (C4V) program is to harness the skills and experiences of veterans who have served our country by training them for second, well-paying civilian careers as software and cyber security professionals.

“They served us all with dedication and sacrifice during their military career and now we are providing them an opportunity to help fill the urgent skills shortage in the IT sector, which is

causing a critical drag on the Canadian economy” said Jeff Musson, executive director of Coding For Veterans. “Veterans feel they can still serve our country but their duty has now moved from the battlefield to cyberspace.”

The program has expanded this year to include military spouses and family members among its students. Most recently, to support the resettlement of those citizens of Afghanistan who served alongside our troops, C4V has opened the program to allow Afghan interpreters who can safely immigrate to Canada, to enroll and retrain for tech sector jobs alongside the CAF members they once served beside. According to C4V it’s estimated that nearly 150,000 software and cybersecurity positions in this country could go unfilled in the next couple of years. For more information click on the image.

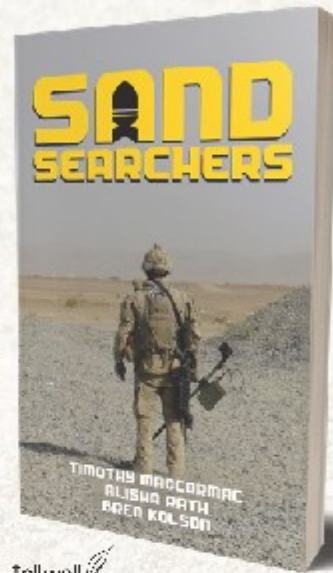
