#### A note from your Padre, April/May 2023

#### **Kindness & Graciousness**

As I do with most of my articles, I begin by saying thank you to all who have served, and to all who are currently serving either in our Canadian Military, as First Responders and other Front Line Workers. Your service to us cannot be expressed in words, so suffice it to say, we appreciate each of you and honour you for your service.

Today I pay special tribute to the two Edmonton Police Service Officers who recently paid the ultimate price in their service to their community. Our prayers are with the serving members of the EPS, and the families of the fallen officers. Thank you for your unselfish sacrifice.

There have been several events or incidents that have occurred which have directed my attention to the topic of this article. On April 05, 2023 I officiated the Funeral Service of a young man 47 years of age, and while that event may not be out of the ordinary, for me anyway, something struck me as we heard about this man's life, which was incredibly difficult during the past ten years because of severe medial issues which brought on much pain which it seemed could not be controlled well. Despite that significant pain he experienced one main word kept coming through, "--- was kind, --- showed kindness all the time, even in the midst of his suffering, --- just seemed to have a kindness gene in him, and despite all he endured, he was gracious with people around him.

His life caught my attention, not because he left many tangible memories behind, but the words, "Kindness" and "Graciousness." I reflected much on those words and realized that as we look around our society it just seems that in many ways we have lost something, that used to be much more visible. We have little patience with people who are difficult or act different than we think they should act. One does not have to drive around the city for long before we realize that there are many drivers out there who are anything but kind in how they drive, and we have only to make a mistake on the road and as happened to my wife and I just a few days ago, (we did not have or come close to causing an accident) but we sure realized the "Beamer" behind us has an amazing horn which blasted for pretty much a whole block. Were we in the wrong, for sure, but there just seems to be a dearth of kindness out there.

Most of us are well aware of the "Golden Rule," which is actually a passage of Scripture found in Matthew 7:12 and are the very words of Jesus:

#### "In everything, do to others what you would have them do to you."

Not only do we want others to treat us well and with kindness, we also want them to speak to us in the same way. I know, sometimes it is necessary to challenge others, and to say hard things, but I will never forget a former colleague with whom I co-pastored a church in Brandon, Manitoba saying to our staff, **"it is not so much what you say to people, but it is important how you say it."** So true.

# **A Talk with the Padre**

I remember well our "immediate past president," regularly reminding us at Executive Meetings, to "Keep it civil." I think what he was saying is, try using a little kindness in the way we treat others. Kindness is just showing respect to those around us, and who does not like to be respected.

One dictionary defines kindness as: **caring about others; by being gentle, friendly and generous.** Webster's definition, **"treating people with respect."** And then a further definition if we still need one, "Being kind means responding to the needs of others."

I think we get the picture, kindness is a much missed yet needed way of treating others, both in how we speak to them, and in how we treat them.

But lest you think it is all negative and no one is kind anymore, that is not the case. Not long ago I became aware of an act of kindness shown by another past president of our Legion. My wife and I had the pleasure of selling tickets at "meat draw," on a Friday night, and said couple won several of the draws. We were then informed and not just informed but shown, that when they win more than one or two draws they give the meat to someone who has not won. Now that is an act of showing kindness that we are talking about.

Kindness in a world that seems not to know the definition of is getting more and more difficult, but we have the best example to follow that I know of, and that is the Life of Jesus Himself. Just a few weeks ago we stopped and were once again shown the ultimate picture of kindness as Jesus gave His life for us, all of us, as He allowed Himself to be crucified on a Roman Cross, not because He had done anything to deserve death, but because of our sin. Giving Himself was without doubt the greatness act of kindness ever bestowed on any human being.

But it was not only this unimaginable act of Kindness, Jesus demonstrated kindness as He walked the dusty pathway of His earthly life, before going back to Heaven where He came from.

His Kindness caused Him to stop and heal a paraplegic man who had lain on a mat for some 38 years. Mark 2:1-12

His Kindness caused Him to stop and play and listen to children, who His followers tried to shoo away. Matthew 19:14

His Kindness caused Him to stop and heal ten lepers, when society had rejected them as being fit to be around, and only one returned in gratitude. **Luke 17:12-19** 

Reading the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke & John will reveal literally dozens of examples of Jesus stopping and showing kindness to a society desperately in need of some. And that makes me think, maybe that is the society we live in today. So, let's not leave being kind to others, when we can show kindness to others.


