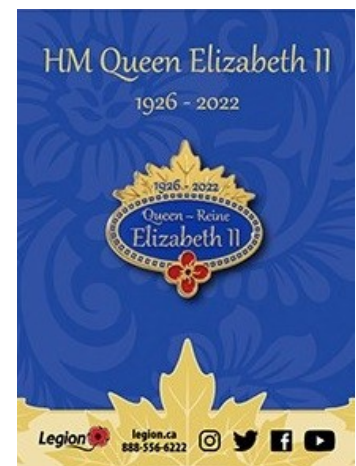
Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Pin

A Talk With The Padre

Recently during a conversation with members of our Legion Executive, I heard the quote “**God let me down again.**” Now I need to explain it was in the context of giving me a hard time and calling me “The God Squad.” (I know it was all in jest.) I also want to ensure our readers that this is NOT an insult, and I wear that title as a badge of honour. I reflected on that comment on my way home, and as is often the case for me, the idea of this article for the Newsletter was born.

It is easy for any of us to conclude that God may have let us down again, but is that really truth? Let me suggest, that while it seems at times when life is tough, and we go through a variety of issues, like health, financial reversals and the list goes on and on, that God does let us down, or forgets about us.

That is how we feel all too often. But what is the truth here? Well, let me try to put another perspective on the feelings that we often experience about God, and His presence in our lives.

For that I want us to reflect on the very first book of the Bible, the book of Genesis, where we read the story of Creation. Within that story, and I would encourage everyone to take the time and read it, we find this writing, Gen. 1:26-28:

Then God said, “Let us make man in our image, according to our likeness. They will rule the fish of the sea, the birds of the sky, the livestock, the whole earth, and the creatures that crawl on the earth.” So, God created man in His own image; He created him in the image of God; He created them male and female.

The “us” God is referring to are Himself, His Son, and The Holy Spirit. We call that in theological terms “The Triune God.” Big words, but it really means God, Jesus and the Spirit. God created the zenith of His creation, man. Here I stop and suggest that a God who creates as His Highest creation, human beings, is not the kind of God who is about to forget about His creation. But wait there is much more to show us that God has not forgotten about us, nor has He let us down.

As we travel through the pages of the Bible, we come to a passage found in the book of Psalms, and in Psalm 139 we read these words.

The All-Knowing, Ever-Present God

LORD, you have searched me and known me. You know when I sit down and when I stand up; you understand my thoughts from far away. You observe my travels and my rest; you are aware of all my ways. Before a word is on my tongue, you know all about it, LORD. You have encircled me; you have placed your hand on me. This wondrous knowledge is beyond me.

It is lofty; I am unable to reach it. Where can I go to escape your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to heaven, you are there; If I fly on the wings of the dawn and settle down on the western horizon, even there your hand will lead me; your right hand will hold on to me. If I say, “Surely the darkness will hide me, and the light around me will be night, even the darkness is not dark to you. The night shines like the day; darkness and light are alike to you. For it was you who created my inward parts;^[b] you knit me together in my mother’s womb.

I will praise you because I have been remarkably and wondrously made. Your works are wondrous, and I know this very well.

A Talk With The Padre

My bones were not hidden from you when I was made in secret, when I was formed in the depths of the earth. Your eyes saw me when I was formless; all my days were written in your book and planned before one of them began. God, how precious your thoughts are to me; how vast their sum is! If I counted them, they would outnumber the grains of sand; when I wake up, I am still with you.

The God who created us in His own Image, who has our entire lives in His hands, who knew us by name before we were even conceived, will not forget His creation, will not forget us as humans, because we bear some of the characteristics of God, after all, "He created us."

Now if that doesn't convince us that we are never far from His presence, unless we choose to walk away from His presence, but even then, He sees us, protects us, and His love for us will never diminish. Regularly at Funeral Services I use the following verses found in the New Testament,

Romans 8:31-37. This is a passage which brings great comfort to us in our times of grief and other difficult times. The God, who created us, the God who knows us and knew us even before we were born, that God makes this promise and commitment to us. First, the writer asks the question, then lays out some of the difficult times we all face, and then His conclusion based on who God is:

Who can separate us from the love of Christ? Can affliction or distress or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Comrades, my prayer is that each of us will grasp the amazing truth of God's faithfulness in each of our lives. **God has done His part, so the choice of either rejecting His part or accepting it, is ours. John 3:16, For God loved the world in this way: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who believes in him will not perish but have eternal life**

My hope is that as we read this piece, it will prepare us for the season we are about to enter, Christmas. I will pick up on the theme that God cares very much for all of us in Christmas Article.

Thousands of CAF members eligible for compensation for drinking contaminated water



Former residents of CFB Valcartier may be eligible for financial compensation due to a ruling regarding contaminated water sources between 1995 and 2006.

In 2012, the Quebec Superior Court ruled that the Department of National Defense (DND), SNC-Lavalin and General Dynamics should pay millions of dollars to those who lived on-base or in the neighbouring municipality of Shannon, Quebec, where water was contaminated with the dangerous carcinogenic trichloroethylene.

It's estimated that thousands of former CFB Valcartier residents may be entitled to compensation, which could total hundreds of thousands of dollars. Any person who believes they are eligible should visit actioncollectiveshannon.ca for more information.
