“LADDERS AND LONGINGS” FOR 2026

“MAKING SURE THE LADDER IS UP AGAINST THE RIGHT WALL!”

By the time you get to read this we will be well into 2026, and “still going strong” on the New Year’s Resolutions we made?? Well maybe not all of them, but hopefully the more important ones, are still within our reach.

It goes without saying that most if not all of us are climbing some sort of ladder. To go higher in our achievements, or our successes? Or, maybe to get higher in our financial standings, or just security in that area.” The truth is that every ladder leads somewhere, but not every destination is one we planned on.”

So, Happy New Year again. January is one of those strange months, at least from my perspective. Things are supposed to feel new and fresh, but for many that is far from reality. It’s often, just more of the same old, same old. The Credit Card bills have been received, and outline in detail where our expenditures have gone. Our desires to change in many ways to make life better, have in some ways gone out the window. The truth may well be that some of the not so good parts of life we experienced in 2025 have followed us into this new year, and we stop and we take inventory about the plans we have made for this new year, and ask, what happened to them. We’ve climbed the ladder, only to realize that it looks like it’s against the wrong wall.

And we begin to think, this life I am living is not the life I thought I was going to live, “there has got to be more to life than this. My life does not feel complete.”

Maybe you are an avid golfer, or you follow golf. If you did you would have read or heard the story of a well-known Golfer, Scottie [Scheffler](#), the number one golfer in the world. Scottie is 29 years old, and has career earnings of 195 million dollars. In July of 2025 he holds a News Conference just before he went on to win another championship. He begins to give an answer which doesn’t seem polished, but almost more thinking out loud. Here is what he says: “quote:

“it’s like why do I want to win this Golf Tournament so badly? Why do I want to win this open Championship so badly? I don’t know, because I win, its going to be awesome for two minutes. Playing Professional sports is a really weird thing to do. Just because we put in so much effort, we work so hard for something that is so fleeting. It really is. The feeling of winning just doesn’t last that long.” When I sit back at the end of the year and try to reflect on things like having that sense of accomplishment from winning the “Master’s Tournament,” from winning the PGA Championship, I have a deep sense of gratitude and appreciation for it, but it’s just hard to explain how it doesn’t. (he pauses here in his address, and the room became quiet) “it just doesn’t satisfy is how I would describe it. It’s an unsatisfying venture.”

Now when someone aged 29 years says, after winning 195 million dollars, it doesn’t satisfy, well we offer to trade places with him or her, and give that a try. This is the life we want to live, and despite how good we want to look, and sometimes on “Face Book,” we actually do, we all make the statement, or at least think the thought, **“there has got to be more to life than this.”** With all the successes I may have experienced. With all the ladders I have climbed to get to where I thought I wanted to be, and now I wonder, **“was the ladder against the right wall?” Is there something more?”**

It seems that not only in modern times do some ask the question Scottie Scheffler asked, **“is there something more?”**

Way back in Old Testament times the wisest man ever to have lived. Solomon was the third King of Israel, following his father, David. By his own admission, he has accomplished everything he set his mind and heart to, and here is just a sample:

Ecclesiastes 2:4-9 I undertook great projects: I built houses for myself and planted vineyards. I made gardens and parks and planted all kinds of fruit trees in them. I made reservoirs to water groves of flourishing trees. I bought male and female slaves and had other slaves who were born in my house. I also owned more herds and flocks than anyone in Jerusalem before me. I amassed silver and gold for myself, and the treasure of kings and provinces. I acquired male and female singers. I became greater by far than anyone in Jerusalem before me.

In all this my wisdom stayed with me.

And here was his conclusion after all this:

**Ecclesiastes 1. “Meaningless! Meaningless!” says the Teacher.
“Utterly meaningless! Everything is meaningless.”**

Then at the end of his life Solomon, after using 5579 words, he ends with this conclusion of what’s really important in life.

**Ecclesiastes 12:13, Now all has been heard; here is the conclusion of the matter:
Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the duty of all mankind.**

Then Years later while He walked on this earth, Jesus had this to say about what is really important in your life and mine, to make sure we climb the right ladders.

In Matthew 6, Jesus teaches on a number of topics, including teaching His followers what we have come to know as; **The Lord’s Prayer**. He then follows his teaching with these words. (I would encourage you to read Matthew 6)

**Matthew 6:33-34, But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore, do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself.
Each day has enough trouble of its own.**

Then Jesus in a sense does what Solomon did. He wraps up His teachings with these words. Words which still stand as beacon for us all:

**Matthew 22:37- 38, Jesus replied: “Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment.
And the second is like it: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself**

My Conclusion on the matter, as we make our way through 2026. Remember that God loves each and every one of us. He loved us enough to give us His Son Jesus to come and die for us. As we walk through 2026 can we give God a chance to direct our steps, to ensure that we pursue the things that really matter? Let me suggest that God offers a life to each of us that I cannot earn, nor can I do anything to warrant it.
