2026 marks the Legion's Centenary year and we've created a beautiful, interactive website that chronicles major events and achievements of the Legion over the past century. From our founding and early advocacy for Veterans, through rehabilitation and national growth after the Second World War, to the modern era and new Veterans – the site is a treasure trove of history – and a great reminder to us all of the proud legacy we all share as Legion members.



In June 1925, Field Marshal Earl Haig attended the national convention of the Great War Veterans' Association in Ottawa, where he spoke to more than 3,000 ex-servicemen about the power of unity. Setting the stage for the National Unity Conference later that year, which ultimately led to the founding of the Canadian Legion

The Canadian Legion of the British Empire Services League was formally incorporated by a Special Act of Parliament on July 17, 1926

“SHEEP, SHEPHERDS & ME” MAY 2026

Ever since I was young, I have had an interest in Sheep, and while they were not my favorite animal, rabbits were, I have been fascinated by sheep. Truth be told I probably would have raised sheep, but since we did not live on a farm, that was not possible. I have raised hundreds of rabbits, but that is not the theme we are following today. Until a year and a half ago, I have a financial interest in sheep, being raised in Saskatchewan.

Sheep are an incredibly interesting animal, while at the same time almost impossible to be trained, or domesticated. Sheep are stubborn animals and very easily distracted. A sheep will wander off following its nose as it were and get themselves into all sorts of difficulty. Sheep are known to eat weeds that are harmful to them and will return to the same patch of weeds time and time again. I guess what I am saying that sheep are one of the dumbest animals there are. And sheep don't attract a whole lot attention from sports teams for example. There are the Lions, the Tiger Cats, the Panthers and so on, and it is easy for fans to cheer those teams on, but it's hard to get your head around "Go Sheep Go," or "Here come your "Edmonton Sheep." You're getting my drift, I am sure.

Okay, so we have established what sheep lack in their make-up, so what makes them so fascinating to so many people? For one thing, Sheep or more likely lambs are much fun to watch in spring. They are carefree, and love to run around and play. If you ever have an opportunity to watch them, don't rush. Sheep have an amazing loyalty to the person(s) that look after them. I have regularly visited the farm where sheep are raised, and where I had some equity. The owner and his family could walk anywhere near the sheep, whether in the farm yard enclosure or out in their pastures, and the sheep would run to them, just by the owners calling. Then they would see, smell, or just notice me, and they would run in the opposite direction. The sheep knew the people who fed them, provided care for them, by removing ticks, or other critters that get caught in their wool. I was a stranger to them, despite the fact that I owned some of them.

Sheep need a shepherd, someone to care for them by taking them to good pasture land, making sure they don't fall into crevasses, or eat weeds that are not good for them. Sheep will not drink from fast moving water sources, so the shepherd must ensure they have clean, still water to drink from. Sheep need a shepherd who will shear their full coats of wool in the spring, and the list of care they require goes on and on.

That brings us to one of the most familiar poems written, and one which I know each of you have heard and probably more than once. It is often read at "Celebration of Life Services," and at the bedside of an ill person. We know it as the 23rd Psalm, or "The Shepherd's Psalm. This Psalm, Song, or Poem, was written by a young man maybe 16-17 years of age, and you guessed it, a shepherd. David, who is best known for saving his people by defeating a Giant, as in, "David & Goliath." David well understood the loneliness of spending weeks out in the pasture, looking after dad's sheep. He was the youngest of 7 brothers, and not considered worthy of much other than shepherding sheep. It was in context he wrote the words to this beautiful Psalm.

We know it as The Shepherd's Psalm;

“SHEEP, SHEPHERDS & ME” MAY 2026 *CONT'D*

Psalm 23 “The Message”

**God, my shepherd! I don't need a thing.
You have bedded me down in lush meadows, you find me quiet pools to drink from.
True to your word, you let me catch my breath, and send me in the right direction.
Even when the way goes through Death Valley, I'm not afraid when you walk at my side.
Your trusty shepherd's crook makes me feel secure.
You serve me a six-course dinner right in front of my enemies.
You revive my drooping head; my cup brims with blessing.
Your beauty and love chase after me every day of my life.**

I don't know about you, but I find those words so comforting. Just knowing that I have my Shepherd Jesus who protects, comforts, provides and leads me. There are too many days, because of illness, immobility at various levels, or perhaps even fearing what the future may hold, that I wonder does anyone really care?

Then I remember; I have a Shepherd who is intimately involved in my life, He guides me, He provides for me, even during my darkest hours. And while I may not like the idea of being compared to a sheep, I am at rest and peace, knowing I have a Good Shepherd, and His name is Jesus.
