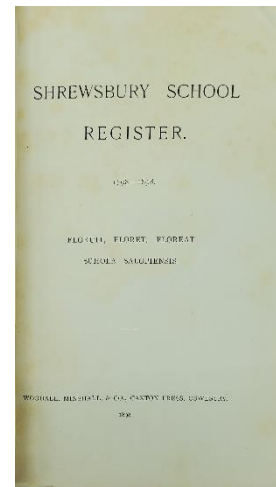
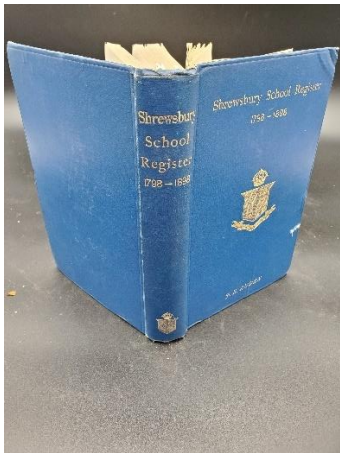

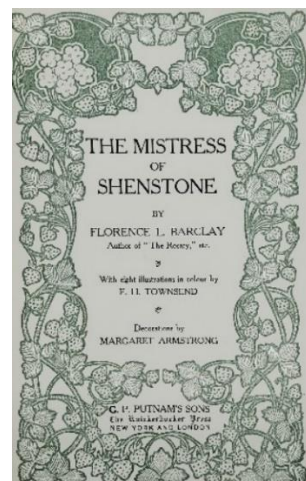
Notes: Shrewsbury School is an English independent boarding school for pupils aged 13–18 in Shrewsbury, Shropshire. Founded in 1552 by Edward VI by Royal Charter, it is one of the seven public schools subject to the Public Schools Act 1868, and one of the nine prestigious schools investigated by the Clarendon Commission between 1861 and 1864.

Notes: 8°; A good example of 19th century Scottish binding with a bookseller's ticket. Back in the good old days, some of your "better" booksellers, of both new and second-hand tomes, often affixed their own custom-printed labels inside the books they sold. These were usually quite tiny (like mini-bookplates) -- rarely bigger than a postage stamp -- and were customarily placed in an unobtrusive spot, most typically at the bottom corner (nearest the spine) of either the inside front or inside rear cover. This was by no means a universal practice, or even an especially widespread one -- it's possible to look through dozens or even hundreds of vintage books without discovering a single label of this sort.

Bookplate of the famous Henry Buxton Forman CB (11 July 1842 – 15 June 1917). He was a Victorian-era bibliographer and antiquarian bookseller whose literary reputation is based on his bibliographies of Percy Shelley and John Keats. In 1934 he was revealed to have been in a conspiracy with Thomas James Wise (1859–1937) to purvey large quantities of forged first editions of Georgian and Victorian authors.



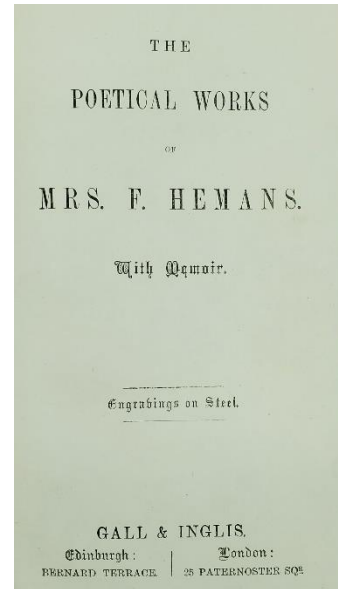

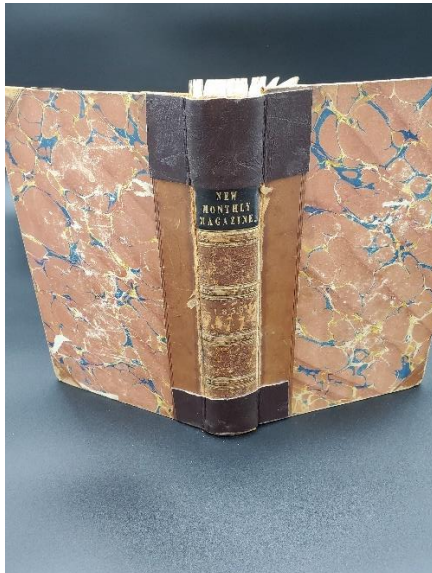

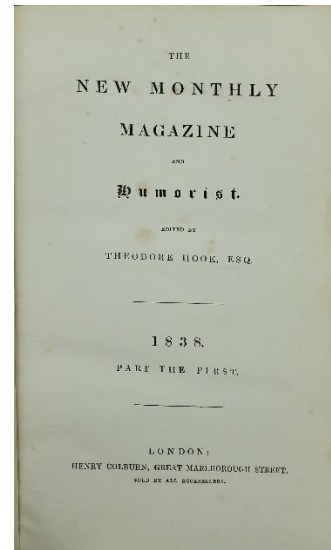


15. **HOOK Theodore.** *The New Monthly Magazine and Humorist.*, London: Henry Colburn, 1838.

The author, Louis Thomassin (Latin: Ludovicus Thomassinus; 28 August 1619, Aix-en-Provence – 24 December 1695, Paris) was a French theologian and Oratorian. In addition to being one of the most learned men of his time he wrote several books of which this is part of a series of "Traité historique et dogmatique" on ecclesiastical fasts, feasts, the Divine Office, the unity of the Church, truth and lying, alms, business and usury.
