• Budgets:

- Bloom Township:
 - Bloom has basically 3 funding sources:
 - Tax dollars
 - Paid Municipal Contract
 - Reimbursement of \$3.00 a ride
 - AgeOptions grant
 - Total program costs vary between the range of \$375,000 and \$475,000
 - They do approximately 21,000 rides a year
 - The bulk of their funding is from tax dollars:
 - Receive about \$50,000 from AgeOptions
 - Receive about \$60,000 from Pace
 - Donation based:
 - Do not charge a fare
 - The transportation service is more and more in demand
 - Increase in rides also yields an increase in costs
 - Bloom's Board is very supportive of Transportation program
 - Townships are doing a lot of paratransit rides
- Palatine Township:
 - The bulk of Palatine's costs are in the maintenance area
 - Palatine leases all of their buses from Pace other than 1 vehicle that they own
 - Palatine's Board is very supportive
 - Ridership has gone up until COVID
 - The Administrator manages the overall budget for Transportation
 - They did purchase a new bus for approximately \$80,000:
 - Approximately half of the funding came from a grant and the other half from the Township
- Wheeling Township:
 - Equipment Maintenance is a big expense which includes bus repairs
 - o About \$60,000 for that line item
 - Palatine owns 4 vehicles and leases 6 vehicles
 - Lease vehicles through Pace VanPool for \$100.00 each a month

- Township responsible for maintenance and reporting which is a lot of work
- o Palatine currently has 12 drivers:
 - 4 are full-time and the rest are part-time
 - They do between 21,000 and 23,000 rides (pre-COVID)
 - They were running the whole time (during COVID)
 - They were delivering groceries for the Food Pantry
- Schaumburg Township:
 - Schaumburg owns all 8 buses in their fleet
 - They have a maintenance line item for bus repair of \$60,000
 - If they don't use all of the money in this line the extra is carried over toward purchasing a new bus
 - Last fiscal year they had \$19,000 carry over towards a new bus
- Hanover Township:
 - Hanover Township has 2 basic funding sources:
 - Tax dollars
 - AgeOptions Grant
 - Received approximately \$26,000 in FY20
 - Total Program costs in FY20 were around \$509,381
 - Bulk of the line costs are:
 - Salaries
 - Health Insurance
 - Vehicle Maintenance
 - Hanover's fleet is comprised of 10 vehicles
 - o 8 are owned
 - 2 are leased through Pace VanPool
 - \$100.00 per month each
 - Township is responsible for maintenance
 - Donation based:
 - Do not charge a fare
 - Peak ridership was 20,000 rides
 - Hanover has 7 drivers:
 - o 6 full-time
 - o 1 part-time
 - New buses are purchased from a vehicle replacement fund
- Discussed ways to receive additional funding:
 - Pace receives funding as a Public Transportation provider
 - Townships provide a lot of rides that Pace ADA would otherwise need to service
 - Should Townships look to Pace for funding?
 - If so, this would need to be on behalf of all Townships united

COVID- Best Practices:

- Schaumburg Township:
 - Schaumburg disinfects the floors every morning and after lunch
 - All handrails are cleaned after each client
 - All drivers and clients wear masks.

- Installed shields in all buses
 - Promote social distancing
- Transport 3-4 clients at a time
- Hanover Township:
 - Maximum of 2 clients to a bus as of June 1st to promote social distancing
 - 1 client to a bus in March/April/May
 - All drivers and clients are required to wear masks/gloves
 - If they don't have them they will provide them
 - All drivers are cleaning the seats and handrails after each client exits the bus
 - They are required to fill-out a cleaning log after each client
 - At the end of the day the buses are brought back to the Senior Center and the Maintenance department is using an industrial sprayer to disinfect each bus
- Wheeling Township:
 - Using industrial spray to clean the buses
 - Masks are mandatory for the drivers and the clients
 - They can wear gloves but are not mandatory
 - Exceptions made in rare cases
 - Maximum of 2 passengers to a bus
 - Largest bus is a 12 passenger
 - Cleaning buses everyday but wiping down the handrails routinely
- Palatine Township:
 - Sanitize the buses daily
 - Must send a log to Pace Municipal daily
 - Using log in Ecolane under alerts
- General COVID:
 - How is everyone getting PPE/supplies?
 - Most Townships are buying cleaning supplies as they see them
 - Some are using their purchasing cards or being reimbursed through petty cash for:
 - Paper towels, Clorox wipes, disinfectant spray, hand sanitizer, etc.
 - Some Townships are using bulk condensed spray instead of individual cans of disinfectant
 - How is everyone offsetting the costs for PPE?
 - Bloom township is trying to recoup costs through the CARES act and FEMA
 - Bloom Township is asking the health screening questions when clients make their reservations
 - No Township other than Hanover has had a client report that they have tested positive while being transported on the bus
 - Hanover followed the CDC guidelines

• Weather Protocol:

- Does anyone have protocol for the drivers pertaining to emergency weather?
 - Palatine Township defers the CDL protocol which states the driver should pull over to a safe place and put on their flashers and wait until it is safe to proceed
 - Other Townships seem to have procedures for employees that reside in the building but not for drivers on the road

Work Groups:

- Palatine Township suggested that they are interested in putting together an Ecolane operations manual and putting together a plan for a pool of shared drivers.
 - If anyone is interested in participating in a work group for either or both subjects, please notify Linda Steininger.
 - Jerald Wolff from Palatine Township volunteered to head up one of these work groups. Linda will pass along your name to Jerald
