City Update: Forefront Dermatology is in their new building in the main floor of the River Loft Condos. Their goal is to hire 125 employees.

Mirro Building: work is being done on the inside of the building. Hazardous materials will be removed on the North exterior wall with high pressure water starting again in March. A bid Document will be released soon to hire a contractor to remove the existing building. Washington Street walls will come down 1st. More public outreach to follow. The downtown plan will happen this year with a new master plan.

Downtown Manitowoc/MCCA Minutes of Meeting 4-12-2017

Meeting called to order at 8am by President Novak.

Financial Report given by Pat Mecca. There are 46 paid members, 4 outstanding: 20 Hotel Guide paid, 1 outstanding: 7 paid for the Crossing (Badger guide) 20 paid for Visitors Guide and 19 paid for Ice on 8th. Pat is working with Hawkins Ash is helping to transition to Quickbooks that will provide reports for the organization.

Hotel Guides: There will be an email asking for those that participated to respond with any changes by 4-17-17, otherwise will be printed as is and invoices will be sent for \$150.00 per ad.

Downtown Planters: Board would like to purchase 6 from Brandon Gauthier who will be reusing materials from Mirro for around \$500.00 each. These will be one of a kind and will be bolted onto the sidewalk. Jeremiah is working with the city to place them between Washington St. and Quay St. on 8th St. The MCCA name and logo will be on them but businesses could purchase more in the future to take ownership and tie all together. City will determine placement of where they will go on the sidewalk. Planting will be done by MCCA before the first crossing of the carferry. Then hoping businesses will step up to the plate and keep them looking nice throughout the season. Working with the city to possibly have them included in their watering schedule.

Businesses should be consulted as to exact placement in front of their establishment. MCCA will also be using the old brown, gray planters and refill them. If businesses still have them, they can bring them down for planting in a designated place. MCCA will let them know when and where.

LOGO Changes: These are being worked on, reestablishing "Downtown Manitowoc"----still MCCA on paper. Just the logo will change. This will match the website of "downtownmanitowoc.org". We will do media blitz to reveal the new look. There is currently a committee working on this.

Sign Me UP: The company would like to get involved with the downtown organization and businesses. A cost sheet was presented to all businesses present to possibly share the cost of billboards. Suggestions to add Downtown Manitowoc somewhere on the ad. Jeremiah will send email to all businesses with John Ashenbrenner's information.

Pastor Karly Kuntz: Anyone interested in the planning process of the Three on Three Basketball tournament in Washington Park should get a hold of Pastor Karly. This would be a way for the younger generation to connect with the community. They need involvement by volunteers and any type of sponsorship, be it financially, door prizes or in any other way.

Progress Lakeshore: Reminded all business owners about their May 3rd 6th Annual Excellence in Economic Development Awards Breakfast, urging members to attend.

City Updates: The downtown parking study is moving forward. Consultants have been lined up and are being interviewed. Some have worked in communities our size. There is a need for parking structures but need to look at all aspects of parking throughout the downtown area, keeping in mind the maintenance of the structure. This study is on the same timeline as the downtown masterplan. They are hoping to create a citizens steering committee of 10 to 15 people. This would be a time commitment of about 8 to 10 months. This will include public input workshops.

A farmer's market committee is being put together including a business person from downtown. They will work on improving the relationship between vendors and the City of Manitowoc and direct where that organization goes from a grassroots perspective starting bottom up with farmers/stakeholders.

Amber Daugs gave an update as Farmer's Market Manager. She is looking for opportunities for relationship building. Looking at local farmers market as being an arm of "Manitowoc Grow It Forward!" This would also allow the market to be under one non-profit status to receive donations and sponsorships. The intent is to turn over the financial side of things to Grow it Forward. It will still be held on Saturdays in the same location. Possibly move Tuesday evening's market to another location, potentially Washington Park. This is all in the discussion phase.

Jason Ring told the group that May 19th is the Carferry startup. A welcome reception will be held on that day. National Tourism week is being held the week of Mary 8th with there being a breakfast on the morning of May 10th with speakers. All are encouraged to attend.

Katelyn from the Maritime Museum reported on Subfest. Planning is going well including a walking historical tour of downtown. Theme is "Home Front". A tribute wall will be outside of the museum honoring women of the war along with a war costume contest.

First German Lutheran would like to do more promotion on the school that is present on their campus including 3K and 4K as being convenient in the downtown area. They would encourage all to pass the word.

Next monthly meeting will be held on May 10th in the evening.

Financial: Pat Mecca gave a financial report. 46 paid memberships, 1 new for 17/18. There are still outstanding memberships, Hotel Guide 17 paid, Ice on 8th 5 paid. Invoices are being sent out for those unpaid.

Planters: Met with the city and they would like to see the design for the planters before they put their stamp of approval on them for a permanent structure on the street. There is an issue with Brandon Gauthier getting materials from the Mirro building at this time. City has scrap materials and he will check with Allstates Rigging to see what they have so he can move forward. We do not want to rush the project, as we want a great result. Downtown Manitowoc will be paying for the first 6 planters when they are ready. Goal would be to have other businesses purchase more for the future. We will be planting and putting in the regular brown planters toward the end of May in the meantime.

Logo Designs: Karen Nichols presented some sample graphics. Some of the feedback was: location does not really say who we are, so maybe go back to Downtown Manitowoc Association on the logo. Lampposts may not be identifiable objects, possibly the Courthouse Dome, bridges, etc. would be better. Karen will take these suggestions back and new samples will be emailed out to all and to please vote and return by a certain date so we can move forward.

Krazy Daze: Board discussed piggy backing this year with Subfest, but look at a possible date change for next year, such as Thursday to encourage people to come down for the sales as a preview to Subfest. Karen from the Maritime Museum talked about the walking tour that will be free to businesses in the downtown area. The Museum is looking for photos of what the buildings downtown looked like and what they housed during WW II. They are having a Maritime History Bus Tour and the Skyline Princess tour on the river. Maritime Museum is working on print materials and would love to see Red White and Blue decorations up and down 8th Street during the Subfest.

City Update: Jason Ring shared an event Windigo Fest around Halloween. There will be a hearse parade and the City will be putting grant money into this. Discussion and questions ensued on how Downtown Manitowoc could get grant money for the events that they host, such as Lakeshore Balloon Glow. All businesses should try to work together on events to help out everyone in the area. Working together is always a better plan and we all bring something to the plate. Grant applications are now available online at the City's website. The Room Tax Commission votes on the applications.

Grow It Forward: Amber Daugs reported that they had 11 vendors participate in the first day of Farmers Market. The frost delayed some in what they had available. They are advertising in the HTR and looking at possibly doing some radio ads. They are working on their charter and immediate issues,

such as location of the Tuesday market, potentially Washington Park. Paradise Foods is already being asked to move out as building was sold.

VIC: Carferry is scheduled to arrive on 5/19 at noon. Please post signs in your businesses and the festivities will start at about 11:30am at the Carferry Docks. 11:45 to 12:15 is expected arrival time. They are trying to rally people downtown. Jason Ring told the group to get their event submitted on line to VIC (Visitor and Information Center) as soon as possible. They also use this calendar to decide on what to put on their digital signage.

Open Discussion: The Seamstress will be celebrating their 20th Anniversary with a ribbon cutting at 11:30 on Friday 5-12. Congratulations to Barb and her staff.

Ladies Night Out---27 businesses participating. The Ladies will get maps that show all partnering businesses. They will receive a ticket and if they get it stamped with a minimum of 4 businesses on each side of the bridge they will be entered in a mystery prize drawing.

Maritime Museum will be having Women of the War dress up contest during Subfest. There will be three categories and Women of the War Tribute Wall. They are looking for any photos to share with the visitors to Subfest.

Clipper City Co-op: A presentation was giving from this group. It is a community-owned grocery store dedicated to providing access to locally sourced food, strengthening the regional economy, and promoting health and well- being. They are striving for 1000 owners. Benefits to business owners being a member, the Clipper City Co-op will promote other business owners on their website and to all the co-ops' members. You can become a member with a one- time investment of \$200.00. They have a business model and hope to be continuing forward with a site selection and then potentially building in 2018-2019. They will be having a full presentation at the Capital Civic Centre on Tuesday, October 24, 2017 from 5 to 7:30pm. Please join them to learn more about their initiative.

Visitor's Guide: Jeremiah asked anyone to get any changes to their ad for the Visitor's guide to him by Friday, October 13 so he can get them to the VIC. There is also still one ad available for \$150.00 to any Downtown Business, email Jeremiah if you are interested. Manitowoc's map will be in the center fold out this year.

Harvest Fest: There was great weather and a great turnout of people at this event. Businesses said they did very well on the retail side. The antique tractors and firetrucks were a huge draw and we would like to continue that for next year, possibly adding to the display. Farmers Market Vendors were very pleased with the day overall. We should possible look at extending the day to keep people down there longer, offering more things. Some people came down later in the day and were disappointed everything was being torn down or already gone.

Evergleams on 8th: They will be brought back this year with 2 people bringing their collection of trees to Downtown Manitowoc. We are looking to get more participants to display the trees. There is a fee to put your business on the map, even if you are displaying your own trees. This will allow people to see where all the trees are. There will be a trolley running and for a small fee, people will be able to board the trolley, stop and get off to shop and then get back on and continue the viewing. The committee is trying to put together a book with the history of these trees and photos that people can potentially purchase. Also, there will be a 5th ornament to sell and a way to celebrate Manitowoc's history. If you still want to do a display please contact Cathy Karl at Heart and Homestead immediately if they want to participate in Evergleems display because she plans to start working with Steve & Fran by the end of Oct.

Capital Civic Centre: Matt Schliesman gave a presentation on their growth plan for the future and was asking for our feedback on their potential plans. They want to be more user friendly which would include more comfort and services, including new seating, wider and more leg room, improving the house lighting, improving traffic flow, increasing restroom capacity and lobby expansion. They are in discussion with a fundraising consultant to see if the money is out there, with a dollar amount they are working with around 2.5 million, more than the Capital has ever raised in the past. A decision will be made later this fall. A suggestion was made to look at adding ADA accommodations in the middle of the ground floor, for those that cannot get to the back or to another level.

Ice on 8th: The Manitowoc Elks will be the sponsor of the event this event and will be coordinating the event with the help of others. Businesses will be receiving information on blocks of ice that will be available for purchase along with carver information.

City Update: One third through the Downtown Master Plan and there will be a public meeting in January to present it to the community. Parking Study is complete and has found a couple areas of concern. There is excess parking in the downtown area at this time and the lease on the public parking space South of the river was not renewed. Both studies are available on the City's website along with the Park Study. Citizens and businesses can go to the website to read all of them.
