Krazy Daze: Still looking for committee to pick a day. Matt Schliesman, Amber Daugs and Vickie agreed to be on the committee. Downtown Planters: Looking for a committee to organize and get flowers ordered and planting date. Also looking for a watering team. City does assist but if summer is dry, all the planters need water more often.

Clipper City Co-op: Trying to bring in 14 new owners today on 2-14-18. Currently there are 368 owners. Site selection process and proforma are being worked on. They are trying to have an event every month to get the word out. March 22 it will be at Petskull, April 19 there will be a listening session. IN May they will be at the market. There will be a board of 9 members and they are in need of new members on the board. The annual meeting will be June 27, 2018. Keep your eyes out for more information. Their goal is to be open by 2020.

City Update: Masterplan on schedule to be completed by end of April-May. Steering committee will meet in February, public workshop will be in April. Parking study is still out there and are looking to make that public soon.

Progress Lakeshore: Nominations are open for their awards breakfast May 15, 2018.

Grow It Forward: Farm Market meeting will be March 1, 2018 at the library. This year they will be launching their night market on 2nd and 4th Wednesday of June and July and 2nd Wednesday in August. They are planning on having bands and food trucks. Tuesday's market will be moving back to Quay Street. Looking for a future home for indoor winter market, more will be coming on that.

In 2021 the CCC turns 100 years old.

Cocoa Crawl has 14 businesses participating.

Mayor Nickels asked the group a question on how the plowing has been downtown. The city is trying a new system. Some businesses said it was OK but some were still talking about too much snow by the curb making it difficult for patrons to park and then get out of their vehicles on 8th street.

Vintage Shop Hop-Manitowoc is on the map for this being held March 2 & 3, 2018. People will be out and about looking for antiques and collectibles. There are over 420 stores involved in this statewide.

St. Patrick's Day Celebration-looking for participants for the parade and sponsorships. This will be the 20th Annual celebration and will be held on Saturday March 17, 2018. The Submarine also turns 75 that day!
