Teaching your child to read:

There is a plethora of phonics material on the market today.

I like to use things that combine audio and video and anything that is hands on.

The basics:

Teach that in addition to the Letters NAME they have a sound

So instead of saying B as in Boy... you will say 'b' like ba its sound...

Teach the short sound of the vowels at first...

<u>Blend</u>: You don't have to learn all the letters sounds before you begin to blend. If a child knows B and A and T.

Then at becomes not "a" "t" in two breaths but "at" in one breath.

Then "b" and "at" two breaths blends into "bat" in one breath.

Then Learn the other Special sounds *

*Vowels can make two sounds they say their name when long.

When do vowels use the long sound?

"when two vowels go walking the first one does the talking"

"at the end of very very short words like me, he, go"

*Blends like cl – you will hear both sounds

blends include: bl, br, cl, cr, dr, fr, tr, fl, gl, gr, pl, pr, sl, sm, sp, st, sc, and sk some blends con contain three consonant: str, spl, and spr

*letters that can make two sounds.. just like the vowels
